


MAY MEETING CANCELLED HOPE TO SEE YOU IN JUNE

Minutes: Motion proposed by Stephanie Shuping and seconded by Yvonne Rodriguez to approve the February board minutes as published in the newsletter.

Presidents Report/Kathy Greene contacted most of the Committee Chair members to see how their jobs were going and to know what concerns they had. Betty Putzka canceled the spring retreat in June due to the uncertainty of Stay-at-Home Orders.

Programs & Challenge/Nette Louton Due to the Stay-at-Home Orders, programs and workshops have been canceled through June except Cheryl Nieman's Ruler Quilting on a Whole Cloth Quilt Workshop. Cheryl Nieman will also teach the second half of her ruler workshop in July. Linda Sullivan of Colourwerx will present the September program and the workshop, Colourbugs & Curves. The workshop will be a week later than usual due to SCCQG's Meet the Teacher meeting that Nette and Pat Crook will be attending. Nette wants to wait to schedule any programs until we know our financial standing. Keep working on your Challenge Quilts!

Programs/Pat Crook We will be using guild people for workshops and speakers for the coming year. With the unknown of the Coronavirus, the September speaker and workshop may have to be rescheduled. A question regarding paying guild members for programs and workshops was posed. It was not fully resolved.

2nd VP Quilt Show/Jamie Harrington The guild may consider canceling the quilt show.

Treasurer's Report/Stephanie Shuping The

Opportunity Quilt has earned \$1824 in sales. After discussion, it was decided that the Opportunity. quilt would be raffled off at the 2021 Quilt Show. Yvonne Rodriguez reported that approximately \$677 was spent on publicity for the quilt show. An ad for the Quilt Show will be in the newspaper instead of the Lifestyle sections due to cost and the quilt show may be canceled. The Country Register ad will be about \$50.

Secretary's Report/Carolyn Lundie The board agreed that Carolyn could have the guild mail forwarded to her house through June due to the Stay-at-Home order.

PARLIAMENTARIAN/Corinne Gurney feels that canceling the Spring Retreat should have been approved by the Board before the decision was made. UFO CHALLENGE Postponing the UFO Challenge until the next guild meeting. TRAVEL Hoffman Tour will be rescheduled. The International Quilt Show in Long Beach has not been canceled. **Opportunity Quilt 2020/21** is nearly ready. Discussion ensued regarding taking both the 2019/20 and 2020/21 Opportunity Quilts to sell raffle tickets. General consensus agreed to hold the 2020/21 quilt until the 2021/22 fiscal year for selling raffle tickets.

Publicity/Yvonne Rodriguez Pat Stauning submitted the quilt show ad to Country Register and AV Press. Country Register will send a bill. Yvonne will be mailing the receipt for banner update to Stephanie Shuping for reimbursement.

Quilt Show/Jamie Harrington said the deposit for the Fair Building is rolled over each year. Pres. Greene reported that Fairground officials are waiting on the Guild's decision regarding having the Quilt Show in May.

Newsletter/Peggy Vachon will not have a problem getting out USPS newsletters as Staples has curbside service and she can order on-line.

Discussion resulted in agreeing to pay United Methodist Church even though we're not holding meetings there for the immediate future.

New Business April 19th General Meeting and workshop canceled. April 17th Board meeting will be virtual via Zoom at 2:00 pm. Pat Crook will send out reminders. **Pres. Greene** has scheduled the Changeover meeting for June 16 at the Greenhouse Café 5:30-8:00 pm. A \$2 fee/person is required in addition to each meal. Need to schedule a budget planning meeting the first week in June. Also, board needs to reduce the philanthropic fabric stash to make it more manageable for the next Philanthropic Chair.

2020 Quilt Show After a discussion regarding the Coronavirus Pandemic and the current Stay-at-Home orders for California, Jamie Harrington moved to postpone the Quilt Show until later in the year. No second was offered. Nette Louton moved that, "At this point in our crazy world, I move that we cancel the 2020 Quilt Show and put our efforts into the 2021 Quilt Show." Pat Crook seconded the motion. Motion passed 3:2. Kathy Greene abstained. Jamie Harrington will send an email informing guild and vendors regarding the cancellation.

AVQA April Board Minutes April 17, 2020

Meeting called to order 2:08 pm via Zoom by President Kathy Greene being in the chair. Carolyn Lundie acting as Secretary. The Board Meeting is being held virtually due to Stay-at-Home Orders for the State of California during the Coronavirus Pandemic.

Presidents Report/Kathy Greene suggested possible fundraisers in lieu of the proceeds from the annual quilt show and asked board members to think about adding more. Suggestions: 1) adding \$3-5 to the cost of new AVQA T-shirts 2) having monthly "Mini Fabric Sales" from philanthropic fabric and fabric in storage 3) keeping all workshops at \$30 and offering a 50/50 split with guild-member teachers 4) extending the 2020 Opportunity Quilt to our 2021 Show and extend our 2021 quilt to the 2022 Quilt Show. A budget meeting will be scheduled the first week of June to be presented June 16th at the Changeover Meeting.

1stVP Programs/Challenge-Nette Louton May meeting and workshop are canceled. June meeting will catch up on all postponed business dealing with the guild. Program will be a long show and share. Cheryl Nieman will present the first part of a 2-part Whole Cloth Ruler Quilting class. Cost will be \$30 per session plus the purchase of a book. There will be two sequential classes, one in June and one in July. **July** program is a FUN installment of officers. July's workshop will be postponed one week because of the Long Beach Quilt Show. **August**/Ice Cream Social, Challenge and the workshop/TBD. **September** Linda Sullivan of Colourwerx will present a lecture, Got Colour? -The Ultimate Color Lecture and the workshop, Colourbugs and Curves is delayed one week.

2nd VP Ouilt Show/Jamie Harrington has agreed to chair the quilt show for 2021. Jamie notified all those involved with the Quilt Show that the quilt show has been canceled. Most vendors will be coming back next year. Vendors rolled over to next vear as of now, Yarnover, Carriage Country Ouilts. Mouse Prints Publishing and Origami Owl. Refunds to Quilty Pleasures, Hummingbird Lane Fabrics, Redfern Enterprises and Ruby Ribbon Shapewear. All quilt show chairpersons have been notified. Stephanie Shuping needs all quilt show chairpersons that have incurred costs for the 2020 quilt show to submit check requests. Next year's quilt show will be May 15th & 16th. Jamie will be setting up vendor applications for next year and they will be on the web site.

Treasurer's Report/Stephanie Shuping

reimbursed \$885 of Quilt Show Vendor's fees. Basic monthly fees for maintaining the guild is \$342.50.

Secretary's Report/Carolyn Lundie No mail has been received except the official notice to temporarily change the address.

Membership/Pat Crook Membership forms will reflect the change in cost of USPS mail costs for newsletters. She needs members to complete the form and submit their membership dues by June. She will offer raffle tickets to those that submit early.

Parliamentarian/Corinne Gurney asked for ideas on how to vote in new officers if we don't meet soon. Suggestions included mail-in ballots and online survey. Voting for By-Laws amendments to take place in June. **Travel** The International Quilt Show in Long Beach is still scheduled to happen. Corinne will ask people to email or call her if they want to go. **Opportunity Quilt Design** The next Opportunity Quilt is finished except for binding and a label. **Publicity/Yvonne Rodriguez** Publicity ads for the Quilt Show have been cancelled. Pat Stauning conveyed that the Country Register will not be charging for the ad.

Newsletter/Peggy Vachon Please get articles to her by Sunday, April 19th.

New Business Corinne Gurney announced Sandy Smith will be next year's Parliamentarian. Kathy Greene got a consensus for keeping next year's quilt show name the same, "Glorious Southern California." It was suggested that we post the new drawing date for the current Opportunity Quilt on the Web site. The May 22nd board meeting will be at 2:00 pm via Zoom.

By-Laws Review

Once we are finally able to have a meeting, we will be voting on the proposed by-laws change that were scheduled to be voted on at the January meeting. As previously stated, the AVCC has discontinued their fiber arts program. We will be presenting 2 choices for your vote to the change in the by-laws. We will be using a written ballot on the day we vote. Here are the 2 choices:

- Option 1. The Scholarship chairman shall:
 - A. Choose two other guild members to be on the committee.

B. Scholarships will be given to any interested individual who submits to the MOAH/Cedar Annual Juried Art Exhibit and Cedarfest Annual Antelope Valley Union High School Art Show. She/he must live in the Antelope Valley and create art using fibers and qualifies according to the specified criteria set by the MOAH/Cedar center. Cedarfest is open to all high school students.

C. The committee will pick the recipients.

Option 2. The Scholarship committee will be dissolved since there is no longer an AVC program

and the funds be transferred to the Programs/Education budget.

You will also be able to suggest other options for this change from the floor.

If there are any other questions on any other proposed changes, please contact me or another bylaws committee member by phone or email to discuss them. Please do **not** use Facebook. This is not the forum for these kinds of discussions. The by-laws were reviewed by the following members – Pat Crook, Nette Louton, Sandy Smith and Corinne Gurney (Parliamentarian).

Please note: all of the proposed changes were made by a consensus of the by-laws committee. They were made with the best interests of the guild in mind and to promote quilting in the Antelope Valley.



<u>Kimono</u> Presented at the March 2020 Meeting **Due at the May 2020 Meeting** Finished Block: 12 ½ inches by 12 ½ inches



This block is made up of cotton fabric using black or black on black for the background and an oriental print for the gown. You can use the same oriental print for the sash or find a small amount of another color.

Cutting Instructions:

Background: black or black on black

Cut one 8 7/8 inch by 8 7/8 inch square and cut it in half from corner to corner to make two triangles. You will need one of the triangles.

Cut three 4 7/8 inch by 4 7/8 inch square and cut each in half from corner to corner to make six triangles. You will need five of the triangles.

Sash: can be made from a small amount of another color or the oriental print

Cut one 4 7/8 inch by 4 7/8 inch square and cut it in half from corner to corner to make two triangles. You will only need one of the triangles.

Kimono: oriental print

Cut one 9 ¼ inch by 9 ¼ inch square and cut the square form corner to corner and then again corner to corner, forming four triangles. You will only need two for this block.

Cut one 6 1/8 inch by 6 1/8 inch square.

How to assemble the block:

Lay out the block.

Take the 6 1/8 inch by 6 1/8 inch square and sew the sash to the top of the block. Press the dark side. Take the other black or back on black triangles and sew them to the 6 1/8 inch by 6 1/8 inch square.

This will make a new square.

Now let's do the sleeves of the Kimono. Sew the black or black on black to each sleeve and press to the dark side.

Take the sleeves and sew them to the Kimono.

Sew the remaining triangle to the top of your block and press to the dark side.

You have finished your block. With the bits left over you can now make one more to match the one you just made.
