Approvals

Minutes for July general meeting were approved, moved by Vicki Brown 1st, Peggy Campbell 2nd, Approved.

Approval of Treasurer's Report for July as printed in the July newsletter was moved by Nette Louton, 1st, Chery Nieman 2nd. Motion passed.

President's Message/Kathy Greene

Kathy thanked everyone from last year's board, showing her appreciation for the board's & member's hard work to keep the guild moving. July would have been our board appreciation meeting.

Philanthropic—Kathy Judkins has agreed to be the chair for Philanthropic.

We had a yard sale on Saturday and made a dent in the stash. Our next sale will be next Thursday, the 20th in the evening starting at 4:30pm to about 8pm in her backyard. The donations will go towards the purchase of batting and backing.

News articles are due Sunday the 23rd.

Next Board meeting is Tuesday, August 18 via Zoom at 6:00pm.

1st VP Programs/Nette Louton

Nette doesn't feel like we should put our money towards high cost speakers when we can only do Zoom until we can meet physically again. If members feel otherwise that we should try doing speakers and workshops via Zoom, please let her know.

This Saturday is a philanthropic workshop to make kits up. We plan to store the kits at people's houses and will call them up to say to bring them in to be worked on when needed.

September speaker has been postponed until January or February, so everyone can be able to attend in person if possible.

She suggested doing a small challenge -- to use black, white and one other color. It can be a mug rug, a quilt, something a little "sparky". This way we can be inspired to start to work on things. Send her a picture in an email to her by next meeting in September. She will put it on a PowerPoint for us to look at.

2nd VP Quilt Show/Jamie Harrington

Jamie discussed the vendors that have signed up for the quilt show. She has rollovers for the fees from many of them. She has about 10 currently. The Vendors List for our 2021 Quilt Show so far are: Al's Vacuum & Sewing, Carriage Country Quilts, Yarnover Truck, Mouse Prints Publishing, Pampered Chef, Gillian Ray, Origami Owl, Pegboard Highway, Quilty Pleasures, Hummingbird Lane Fabrics, Redfern Enterprises, Ruby Red Shapewear, Tiki-TPG-Designs, Trouble Maker Bags (Formerly Pincushion), Hand Dyes by Kristin, Cherry Berry Quilts (they have to ask Bernina if they can do our show), Calico Mermaid (they will let me know in Jan 2021).

We need auction quilts, runners, totes, wearables, kits, tops. We need basket raffles. We need a chair for the Boutique as well.

Pat Crook said that Al's Vac & Sew is donating a Jazz 2 Sewing Machine by Babylock. The store suggested that members could start selling tickets for the machine now, not waiting for when we can take the opportunity quilt out. We cannot sell the tickets online due to 5013C regulations. We can also sell the tickets when we do finally get to show the opportunity quilt again. We will have to mail the tickets out and the person then sends the money they collected to the guild.

Secretary's Report/Corinne Gurney

Corinne discussed that there is a shortage of plexiglass due to COVID-19, and cutting rulers are going to go up substantially next month in price, so if there is a ruler you want, now is the time to buy.

UFO Challenge – We will be starting this up again. The current number to work on is number 5. Corinne will draw the next number in September. To win the charm and have your name in for the drawing, you can either email or text her a picture. She will keep track of how many charms you have won and put the names in the drawing. Once we can physically meet again, each person can choose their charms.

Membership/Pat Crook

Today we have 23 members present via Zoom. We have 72 members who have renewed their membership this year.

Pat has put off the drawing for renewing to give everyone a chance to do so until tonight. She has 6 prizes: Matchbox Kits, 2 of each, green, red and blue. She used a "virtual wheel' to pick the winners. The winners were Evelyn Hatch, a green one, Sharon Hayes, a red one, Antoinette Pappas, a blue one, Sandra Lane a green one, Sylvia Darroch, a red one, and Vicki Brown a blue one.

She will do the wheel again next month but only the people in attendance will win a prize, like our door prizes when we physically meet.

The Challenge - People were asked to send Nette a picture of their quilt and a PowerPoint presentation was shown of the 5 pictures sent in. Two people showed theirs on Zoom. There are no prizes given out. This was mainly for fun.

Minutes of AVQA Board Meeting Aug 18, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 6:06pm. Kathy Greene, President presiding, Corinne Gurney as Secretary. Kathy thanked everyone for their dedication to the guild and all their hard work. Pat Crook pointed out that you have to be sent a new invitation to each Zoom meeting. If you are not on her regular email list for the board members, please request an invite from her if you want to attend it.

President's Welcome/Kathy Greene Approvals

Approved minutes from July Board meeting as printed in the August newsletter, Sandy Smith 1st, Jamie Harrington 2nd, approved.

President's Message/Kathy Greene

Kathy asked about the planned sale at her house on Thursday. She requested to postpone it due to the excessive heat and the smoke from the Lake fire. It was agreed to postpone for 2 weeks which makes it September 3^{rd} , 4:30 to 8ish. This would make us keep the shed for the month of September. It was agreed also to pay the extra month since funds are readily available. We earned over \$500.00 at the sale held at Nette Louton's home.

1st VP Programs/Nette Louton

Nette found a great video on precuts, discussed using that in a meeting. She will work with Pat Crook to see how that can be done. She doesn't think it is right to spend the money for a speaker until at least 50% of the guild can attend. She recommended doing "sew-ins" for workshops to bring the members together and to be in contact with others.

Pat Crook recommended doing just a regular sew-in in September. In October we could do a "1600 Quilt" competition for philanthropic. A "1600" quilt uses a 40 strip "jelly roll" to make a quilt top. It would be a timed sew in with prizes for the fastest, etc.

Sylvia suggested we start using guild members as speakers, so we have a meeting with a speaker. Meetings will probably be on Zoom until the end of the year. Nette talked about having speakers next year. People mainly want to make physical contact with each other. We will leave the workshops as open sews for the members. Sylvia suggested marking with blue tape to make sure everyone is 6 feet apart. We would need to have a reservation to take part, cap it at 15 people, everyone would have to wear a mask, indicate how long you plan to stay, going from 9 - 3. The sew-ins would be September 12^{th} and October 10^{th} .

2nd VP Quilt Show/Jamie Harrington

The quilt show is coming along very well. Peggy Campbell donated 2 quilts for the auction. Jamie will contact Al's Vac & Sew regarding the machine they are donating to the guild. She talked to the Franchise Tax Board about our refunds. They are slow due to the pandemic, but they are working on it.

Treasurer's Report/Stephanie Shuping

Stephanie was absent, no report is available.

Secretary's Report/Corinne Gurney

Corinne received an offer for Stamps.com. Due to the fee they charge, it is not worth it.

UFO Challenge is starting up again this month.

Parliamentarian/Sandy Smith - No report Membership/Pat Crook

Peggy Vachon requested a list of those who have not renewed their membership, so she can delete them from the mailing list. Pat will let her know once she has her Excel report done. There are 72 people who have paid so far.

She gave out the prizes at the general meeting and will be doing a drawing at each meeting for everyone who attends the meeting.

Philanthropic/Kathy Judkins

Reported by Kathy Greene, Nette took 20 quilts to Care Net and 20 quilts to the Children's Center, and Terri Moss took 11 quilts to Care Net, making a total of 51 quilts donated.

We made a lot of quilt kits on Saturday. We did not take a final count. We are making a dent in the stash the guild has.

Retreats/Betty Putzka

Betty is not getting a response from the hotel regarding our October retreat. We should know by our September meeting if we are able to have the retreat. If it does occur, we will not be able to have 20 people at a time in the sewing rooms. We may have to stagger the times for people to sew. We are trying to find a way to make everyone happy as best we can under the circumstances.

New Business/Kathy Greene

Nette discussed the Suffragette challenge. She was impressed with what everyone turned in. She liked how the PowerPoint worked to show the quilts rather than try to show over Zoom. The new challenge will be out in November.

She discussed the Black & White plus one color. The purpose is to inspire people to sew. It doesn't have to be finished, can be any size, a mug rug even.

Peggy Vachon now has the opportunity quilt. She made a new label, making necessary changes to it. It is available once we can start selling tickets again. Meeting adjourned at 6:51pm.

Philanthropic

With great trepidation, I accepted the job of Philanthropic chairman. Having been a member of the Bits & Pieces friendship circle, I had a pretty good idea of the immensity of the Philanthropic stash. I also know how hard Michele Cameron and Lynell Rodio before her worked to get a huge number of quilts completed and donated. The Philanthropic stash included dozens of quilts, kits, tops, a box of binding, batting, and so much fabric that we're having to give some of it away ... no one has room to store it all!

Thanks so much to Kathy Greene, Nette Louton, Pat Crook and her husband Steve, Coral Brown, Jamie Harrington, Yvonne Rodriguez, and Terri Moss for moving everything out of Michele's garage and into a temporary storage shed, and/or for organizing fabric and transporting it to Nette's and Kathy's for the yard-sale fabric giveaways.

During the yard sale at Nette's and the philanthropic workshop, AVQA members took home approximately 30 kits to quilt. I currently have in my house 34 complete kits ready to quilt and 31 incomplete kits (needing batting, backing, and/or binding). I also have 108 tops, 3 tubs of fabric, 1 large tote bag and 1 box of flannel, a half-full box of binding, and some batting. In the guild's permanent shed, there is a large bag of kits for making tops. In the temporary shed there is fabric, fabric and more fabric.

Last month, Nette Louton delivered 20 quilts to CareNet and 20 quilts to the Children's Center. Last week, Terri Moss delivered 11 quilts to CareNet. I have 10 completed quilts and 2 animal shelter quilts. When I have a few more, I'll distribute them.

Thanks so much to everyone who has pitched in to help get quilts done. Please let me know if you would like to help. If you don't enjoy quilting but like to bind or piece tops, just let me know and I'll happily deliver or put out for pick-up whatever you request.

SCCQG News

A friendly note from your SCCQG rep: The last meeting I attended was in January of this year. That meeting topic was how to use the buttons on media pages. For me, it became more confusing. Social media is a great way to contact and encourage new members to join. It shows what the guild is doing and may inspire membership. What I learned from this meeting is that updating media pages is a lot of work but a great way to reach out to the community to show what the guilds are about and their involvement.

Matt Reese from Road to California stated that the Road quilt show is still planned for January. It may be different due to the pandemic. Class registrations start August 1, but if the pandemic changes things, they have a rollover plan for classes to 2022. The dates for 2021 are January 21 -24.

An amendment to the SCCQG bylaws was changed and passed about Guild membership dues. IF MEMBERSHIP DUES AREN'T PAID BY NOVEMBER, RATE WILL INCREASE FROM \$40 TO \$65. This is to prevent late dues and encourage guilds to pay on time.

Meet the Teachers was cancelled this year, but program chairs can visit the SCCQG website and see teachers' personal pages. Some teachers even set up a short video presentation of their work; you just scroll to the right. There will be a new venue for 2021 Meet the Teachers. It is at Torrance Art Center on April 10th. The parking is free and you can bring your own lunch or there may be pre-order lunches. All information will be after October 1, 2020. There will be 35 booth spaces and spots for three opportunity quilts. More information will be in the October newsletter.

The program was about Zoom meetings or virtual meetings since there are other sites than just Zoom. Virtual meetings can be recorded. You just have to state in the beginning that it will be recorded. Any meeting can be virtual such as guild elections, demos, workshops, show and share, committee meetings, retreats, sew-ins, just about anything.

Having programs with teachers was discussed. You can hire more teachers abroad. There wouldn't be any travel fee or hotel reservations to be made. You can break into segments. Don't expect fees to be lower, but they might be. You need to check with the teacher in question and adjust your contract accordingly.

Both guilds and teachers/speakers may need to update contracts to cover the change. Teachers can control their Zoom/virtual classes. This way, their presentation won't be copied.

Zoom account can be free and can have up to 100 participants and no security. If you want more security, the cost is \$14.99 per month or \$149.99 annually for unlimited meetings. A suggestion was to have a Virtual Committee with a tech team that can help with tech problems. DO NOT POST MEETING LINKS ON YOUR WEBSITE! Anyone and everyone could join the meeting.

Due to the pandemic or even other emergencies, guilds should include virtual guidelines in the Bylaws. It should include etiquette, how to conduct the meetings, host guidelines, etc. You should plan ahead for these meetings and start early enough to give members a chance to sign in. If you plan to record the meetings, you need to state to everyone that it's being recorded. Another suggestion for when you have show and share is to have a picture sent in to one person and make a slide show to share.

Quilt Show

Al's Vacuum & Sewing has donated a Baby Lock Jazz II sewing and quilting machine.

We will be selling raffle tickets for the drawing on Sunday, May 16th, 2021.

Raffle ticket packets of 24 tickets will be made available. Tickets are \$5 for 6 tickets or \$1 for one ticket.

Calling all members: We need quilts for the show. We need your talent. It is not too late to start a quilt, finish UFO's (Not Unidentified Flying Objects, but Unfinished Objects).

You can start and finish Auction items. Auction items needed are quilts (bed size, wall hangings, miniatures), purses, totes, table runners, place mats. We will be accepting kits and quilt tops. So if you have a quilt top, not finished, we will auction that as well.

If you have a vendor that you would like to see at our show. I will need contact info ... name, email address or phone number. A vendor application is on our Website. We need your help. We need quilt show advertisement to be posted on all social The only problem people complain about is the muting and unmuting. Having a co-host can help with that problem. If you have a virtual workshop, make sure there isn't a member that has a "workshop party" that shares with nonpaying person. There wasn't a solution on that, but hopefully guild members are honest and trustworthy and wouldn't do that. Do you charge guests for the virtual meetings and how to you collect? One answer is to set up Pay Pal or let guest in free and hope they join the guild.

As you can see, there is a lot of information at all SCCQG meetings. On the Zoom meetings, it was nice not having to get up to leave by 6 am or 7 am depending on how far you have to drive, dealing with traffic, wear and tear on your car. Is this the future of guilds? Who knows. There is a Virtual Guild in Alaska (TQC Virtual Guild). You can check their website, <u>www.quilter-calendar.com</u>.




<u>Membership</u>
