Treasurer's Report: Sharon Hayes moved to accept the treasurer's report as published in the March newsletter. Seconded by Melanie Karnavas. Motion carried.

AVQA Board Meeting Minutes -- April 19, 2022

Meeting called to order 5:42 pm at Peggy Campbell's Sewing Studio, by President Donna Roberts with Carolyn Lundie acting as secretary.

Greeting/President Donna Roberts: Welcomed all and thanked Peggy Campbell for making the studio available for the meeting.

Minutes: The March board meeting minutes were published in the April newsletter. President Donna Roberts ask if there were any corrections? Stephanie Shuping proposed a correction to the sentence, "A discussion regarding the Opportunity Quilt resulted that the quilt should be raffled off this fiscal year" should be changed to "Diane Grooms proposed that the opportunity quilt and Jazz sewing machine be raffled before the end of the fiscal year. No second. Motion failed." Peggy Campbell moved to accept the March board meeting minutes with corrections as noted. Seconded by Stephanie Shuping. Motion passed.

Programs/1st **VP Pat Crook:** Pat and Nette Louton are trying to get Lujean Seagal to lecture on "Beyond Borders" for a Zoom presentation for May. In the event that they can't get Lujean, a presentation over everything you wanted to know about thread will be shown. Challenge entries will be shown in May. The June guild meeting will be a skit on the presentation of officers.

Ways and Means/2nd VP Jamie Harrington: Jamie scheduled the '23 Quilt Show for May 20th and 21st at the AV Fair and Event Center. A \$1000 deposit has been rolled over there. Peggy Vachon and Stephanie Shuping are meeting to brainstorm quilt show ideas and welcome suggestions. Jamie has Jazz sewing machine tickets available.

Treasurer's Report/Stephanie Shuping: Income and Expenses report was sent to the Executive Board. Net income was negative \$4,203.86 because she refunded vendor fees for the last 3 years. It was necessary to order more checks and deposit slips for \$311. Donations were from Amazon Smile, Network for Good, Kathy Greene and the free table. She will schedule an audit and budget meeting before the June board meeting. Proposed 2022-'23 budget meeting will be May 11, 3:30 pm on Zoom. A change in the date of the June board meeting to June the 21st was decided.

Parliamentarian Report/Nette Louton: Anyone leaving an office, please bring books and keys to the June 21st changeover board meeting.

Membership/Peggy Campbell: Several new people were at the general meeting. The \$3 fee for visitors will be waived for the remaining fiscal year. Suggestions were made to encourage members to sign up before July. It was confirmed that there was enough money in the budget for membership cards, and it was confirmed that people attending the retreat must be members.

Philanthropic/Kathy Judkins had items in her car for the future auction and raffle and asked people to take them.

Web Master/Door Prize Chair/Kathy Greene: Kathy received approval to give away tickets for the door prizes rather than sell them. In the past, members purchased tickets to win the door prize.

Opportunity Quilt Promotion/Donna Roberts: Six people picked up their original tickets, and there were additional purchases at the general meeting. Terri Moss has offered her land in Lake Hughes to place a storage shed. A discussion resulted in continuing with the current storage rental.

Old Business: After discussion, it was decided that a vote will not be taken on the date to hold the raffle for the current opportunity quilt until the new opportunity quilt is completed. Kathy Greene will

be meeting with Corrine Gurney to see when the quilt will be finished.

Announcements: Please get newsletter articles to Peggy Vachon by Sunday, April 24th. Timely submissions are greatly appreciated. Carolyn Lundie reported that the Chula Vista Quilt Show will be on May 13th and 14th.

Babylock Jazz II Sewing and Quilting Machine

Al's Vacuum and Sewing in Lancaster has donated a Babylock Jazz II Sewing and Quilting Machine to AVQA.

This machine has 12" workspace, 28 built-in stitches with stretch stitch capabilities, 1000 stitches per minute, programable needle up/down, handsfree presser foot, 9 feet included, automatic needle threader, and automatic bobbin winder.

We are selling tickets - a ticket packet is 24 tickets for \$20. Six tickets are \$5 and a single ticket is \$1.

Thank you to Terri Moss, Judy Miller, Betty Putzka, and Joan Tyler, for contributing 3 quilts to our Children's Center donation, as well as 165 burp cloths and 6 baby blankets to CareNet. Thanks also to Judy Adams for donations; Kathy Greene for taking donations from the community at large, sorting through them, and storing them until I can take them; Nette Louton for helping Kathy sort the donations; Diane Grooms for giving me tops, backing and blocks she found in the guild's storage shed; and Jean Ellison, former owner of Big City Fabrics, who donated a large number of patterns and many yards of fabric. If I have left anyone out, please let me know so that I can thank you in next month's report.

I currently have 147 tops ready to be bundled with batting and backing. (I reported 97 at the board meeting, having forgotten about a storage box containing 50 tops under my dining table.) I also have 14 tops that need borders added or need to be taken apart to make smaller quilts. There are 15 quilt sandwiches ready to quilt, 3 pre-quilted panels ready to bind, and 3 pet shelter quilts to pillowcase and quilt. We have boxes of flannel and regular cotton fabric to use for backing, binding, and quilt kits. If you would like to make kits, sew tops from kits, quilt the tops, or bind the quilts, please let me know.
