Meeting called to order 5:36 pm via Zoom by President Donna Roberts with Carolyn Lundie acting as secretary.

President Donna Roberts: Welcomed all.

Minutes: Nette Louton moved to accept the April Board Meeting Minutes as published in the May newsletter and a second was heard from Peggy Campbell. Motion passed.

Programs/1st VP Pat Crook said that it is necessary to end the general meeting by 8:00 so we can get out by 8:30. To achieve that, break needs to be limited to 10 minutes. Hospitality needs to arrange with the church to get the Wifi password from the church and make sure Zoom runs correctly on their TV. The June program will be the changeover meeting with the quilting astronaut, Karen Nyberg, presenting "Quilting in Space" via Zoom. Anyone with Karen Nyberg's fabric from Robert Kaufman is asked bring it to the next meeting. After a discussion it was decided that meetings should continue at the church for the near future for consistency. Sylvia Darroch has arranged with Edwards Federal Credit Union in Palmdale for a room for a few months for workshops/philanthropic. Nette Louton will arrange for a verification letter from Edwards Federal Credit Union for insurance.

Ways and Means/2nd VP Jamie Harrington collected \$50 for Jazz sewing machine tickets at the last guild meeting.

Secretary/Carolyn Lundie asked about mail from Domain Listing. It was decided to disregard.

Membership/Peggy Campbell: So far, seven people have renewed. Peggy has kept a list of

people to whom to distribute Opportunity Quilt tickets after they are printed. Jamie Harrington said that new tickets can be purchased at Bohn's Printing when we're ready.

Philanthropic/Peggy Campbell for Kathy Judkins: Peggy picked up several quilts at the general meeting and is taking 8 or 9 philanthropic quilts to Kathy Judkins.

Web Master/Door Prize Chair/Kathy Greene:

Door Prizes will continue as freebies for now. Peggy Campbell offered to keep the new Opportunity Quilt at the studio for availability of distribution. Kathy indicated the need to have someone step up for Opportunity Quilt Promotion. She also collected \$76 from the free table and will take responsibility for collecting donations from the free table.

Newsletter/Peggy Vachon is continuing as Newsletter Chair. Articles are due the first Sunday after the board meeting. Being prompt is very appreciated.

Retreats/Betty Putzka sent out a bulletin to all those going to the retreat to remind them that the final balance needs to be paid by the June meeting. Make out checks to AVOA.

Treasurer/Stephanie Shuping: Our total income for this fiscal year is -\$5,078.18 due to refunds of vendor fees from previous fiscal years. \$2000 was transferred from the money market account to the checking to avoid a service fee. **Budget** A discussion of the budget ensued and some progress was made. The budget will be finalized at the June meeting.

Old Business: The next Board Meeting will be June 21st instead of the regularly scheduled time. It will be in-person at Peggy Campbell's studio or Nette Louton's. Note the change: this is NOT the usual time. The general meeting will be on Zoom and inperson. Donna Roberts will not be in-person at the next General Meeting but will be on Zoom.

Meeting adjourned 6:58 pm.

Babylock Jazz II

Al's Vacuum and Sewing in Lancaster has donated a Babylock Jazz II Sewing and Quilting Machine to AVQA. This machine has 12" workspace, 28 built-in stitches with stretch stitch capabilities, 1000 stitches per minute, programable needle up/down, hands free presser foot, 9 feet included, automatic needle threader, and automatic bobbin winder. We are selling tickets – a tickets packet is 24 tickets for \$20. Six tickets are \$5, or an individual ticket is \$1.

This machine will be raffled off at the 2023 Quilt Show.
