



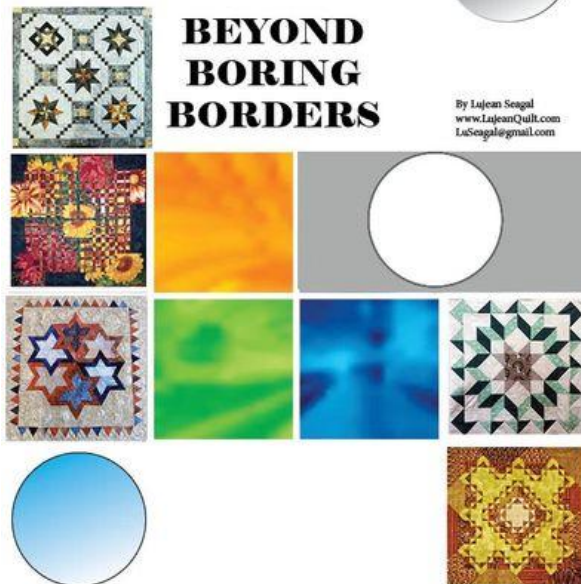

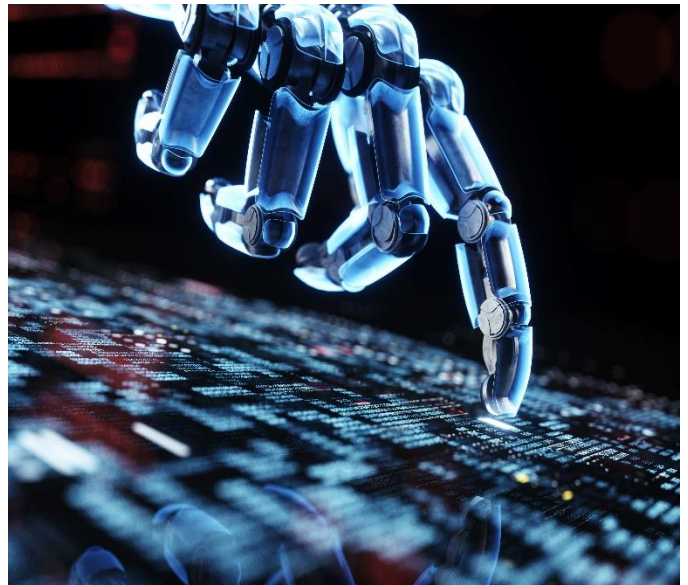

## **Baby Lock Jazz II**

Al's Vacuum and Sewing in Lancaster has donated a Baby Lock Jazz II sewing and quilting machine to AVQA. This machine has 12" workspace, 28 built-

in stitches with stretch stitch capabilities, 1000 stitches per minute, programable needle up/down, hands free presser foot, 9 feet included, automatic needle threader, and automatic bobbin winder. The guild is selling tickets – ticket packet is 24 tickets for \$20. Six tickets are \$5 and one ticket is \$1.
