Kathy Amparan



AVQA member Kathy Amparan will present a trunk show and lecture entitled “Polyester to Paint” at this month's guild meeting. Kathy grew up here in the Antelope Valley. She made her first quilt in the 1970's from that quintessentially 70's fabric, polyester. She says she didn't make her first real quilt until 1990 when she lived in Wrightwood and became friends with the owner of the quilt shop there.

Kathy and her husband volunteered their home for the first Pine Needles Quilt Guild home tour and quilt show in Wrightwood. She has been active in the Pine Needles and Desert Winds quilt guilds and has had a wearable arts group in Hesperia.

Kathy has developed her skills as a painter through oil painting and wearable arts classes that included silk painting and dyeing. She started applying these techniques to her quilts. She has also taught a painting class at Bolts in the Bathtub.

In her workshop, "Paint Your Quilt," Kathy will teach different methods for using Paintstiks with stencils and rubbing plates to create original and unique designs. You can use your painted fabric to make a small quilt, table runner, or any other item you want to make. Kathy will challenge you to create something extraordinary. The workshop will be held on Saturday, July 10, at Bolts in the Bathtub. You can register for the class by calling Jamie Harrington at 947.7604, or you can sign up at the July guild meeting. Kathy will have some of the supplies needed for the workshop for sale at the guild meeting.

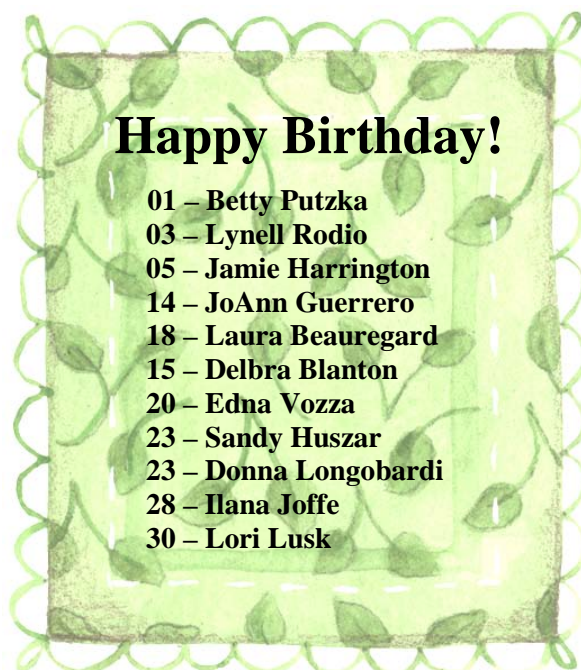

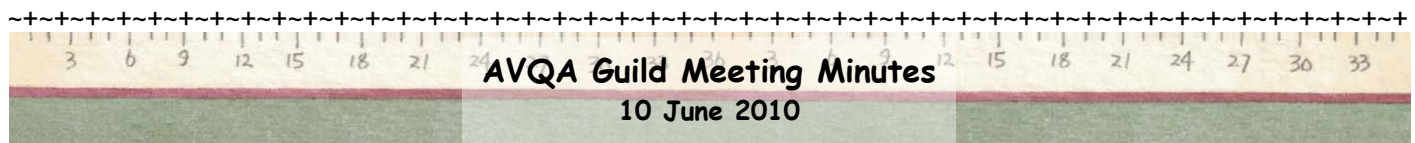

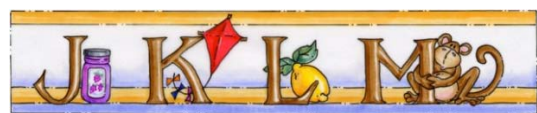

THE FLOUR SACK

In that long ago time when things were saved, when roads were graveled and barrels were staved, when worn out clothing was used as rags, and there were no plastic wrap or bags, and the well and the pump were way out back, a versatile item, was the FLOUR Sack!

Pillsbury's best, Mother's and Gold Medal, too stamped their names proudly in purple and blue. The string sewn on the pulled and kept; the flour emptied and spills were swept. The bag was folded and stored in a sack that was durable, practical, FLOUR sack!

The sack could be filled with feathers and down, for a pillow, or twould make a nice sleeping gown. It could carry a book and be a school bag, or become a mail sack slung over a nag. It made a very convenient pack, that adaptable, cotton Flour sack!

Bleached and sewn, it was dutifully worn as bibs, diapers or kerchief adorned. It was made into shirts, blouses and slips. And mom braided rugs from one hundred strips; she made ruffled curtains for the house or shack, from that humble but treasured FLOUR sack!

As a strainer for milk or apple juice, to wave men in, it was very good use, as a sling for a sprained wrist or a break, to help mother roll up a jelly cake, as a window shade or to stuff a crack, we used a sturdy, common Flour sack!

As dish towels, embroidered or not, they covered up dough, helped pass pans so hot, tied up dishes for neighbors in need, and for men out in the field to seed. They dried dishes from the pan, not the rack that absorbent, handy FLOUR sack!

We polished and cleaned stove and table, scoured and scrubbed from cellar to gable, we dusted the bureau and oak bed post, made costumes for October (a scary ghost) and a parachute for a cat named Jack. From that lowly, useful old FLOUR sack!

So now my friends, when they ask you as curious youngsters often do, 'before plastic wrap, Elmer's glue and paper towels, what did you do?' tell them loudly and with pride don't lack, 'Grandmother had that wonderful FLOUR SACK!'

Quilting Tips from Fons & Porter's Love of Quilting

Pattern Storage: After cutting out pieces for an appliqué project, put the pattern, freezer paper pieces, cut fabric pieces, and the selvages with the names of the fabrics into a plastic page protector.

No more loose ends: To secure loose ends on spools of thread, wrap them with a piece of elastiband. This is a product made to hold gauze in place, and can be purchased at a medical supply store. Sometimes at the drug store too.

Template Handle: Sometimes you may find it hard to pick up templates, so cut a piece of painters tape and make a little 'handle' Problem solved.

Scrappy Binding: Love scrap quilts and hate to waste fabric, so save the leftover lengths of binding & join them to make binding for scrap quilts. This saves time later, and the scrappy binding will look great on your quilts.

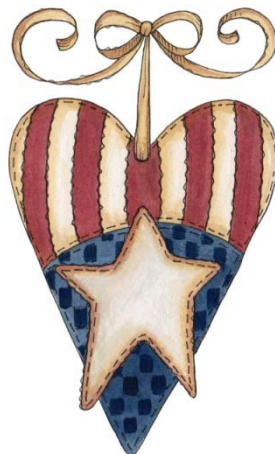
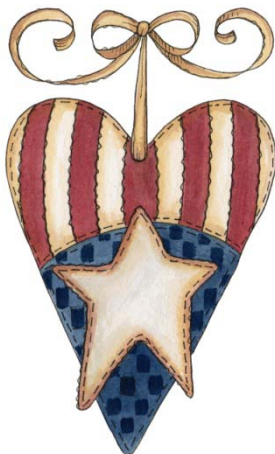
