FEBURARY PROGRAM: Heidi Stagno "How Do I Quilt that Quilt Top?"

Heidi Stagno will present the February lecture, "How Do I Quilt That Quilt Top." She is a long arm quilter and learned to love and appreciate quilting from her Grandma Leota while growing up in Pocatello, Idaho. Today, Heidi lives with her husband John and twin, 6-year-old daughters.



Heidi loves to quilt on her Longarm machine. In the span of one year she got married, bought a house, bought a quilt shop, and was pregnant with twins by the end of the first year." Heidi recently sold the quilt shop and is back to quilting full time. In addition to her machine, she also has two machines that she rents out and teaches longarm quilting on. And, she is a Handi-Quilter Dealer.

What is Heidi's method for longarm quilting? "I love developing the depth, dimension, and texture on quilt tops. My students ask me, 'How do you know what to quilt on so many different quilts?' My answer is: "look into the quilt and it will tell you. While I have not experienced a quilt that will actually talk to me, I do investigate the piecing,

the fabric, and the scale of design, the style or theme. The answer is very simple "opposites attract." If the quilt has busy fabric or lots of piecing, I go simple. If the quilt is plain and simple I dress it up with fancy stuff. Then I go to work auditioning designs with preview film."

Saturday's class is titled, *Free Motion Fundamentals*, a beginner's free motion quilting class. It covers threads, needles, tension, machine settings, layering the quilt, and about 6-7 quilting designs. The workshop will be held at City of Hope, 44151 15th St. West, Lancaster -- from 9:30 am to ~3:30pm on Saturday, Feb. 11th.

'Meet the Teacher' with Heidi Stagno will be at Camille's Sidewalk Café, 44140 20th St. West, Lancaster. See you at 5:00pm prior to the general meeting on February 9th. We hope to see you there!

If interested in these positions, please contact someone on the board. Did you know that there are 94 guilds members of the SCCQG?

Future programs that will be talked about are Bylaws and how to run a meeting (July), Out of the box fundraisers (October) and Membership how to keep, retain and get new members in January 2018. Anyone interested, please let me know and we can ride or meet at the meeting.

If you want to have a picture of the opportunity quilt on the website, you need to send a picture to info@sccqg.org. Also send information about your guild events to get on the calendar. It was suggested

that board members of the guild should subscribe to the SCCQG newsletter. There is also information on the website if you want to order lunches for the Meet the Teachers Meeting held in April. These need to be in by March 15. This is a new website the SCCQG are using and encourage guild members to check it out.

Topic was about Programs. It was suggested to review the guild's contract before going to hire speakers. Check out the guild's cancellation policy and the speaker's before hiring. Be sure this and all agreements are written out. The most important thing is COMMUNICATION with all parties involved. If you are the program chairperson, be sure to check on future budgets of the guild if you have to hire a speaker. This is good to know if you want to hire a popular speaker. When you do communicate with a speaker, be sure you have every contact information in your email, letter, or even telephone calls. Another idea is to check on how samples of workshop or items need to be handled for return mail. Make sure this is also included in the contract especially if guild is responsible for mailing items back. Also ask the speaker to have a return label included. If a speaker is to be picked up from an airport, have a picture sent to her/him for recognition. Also have a back- up plan if you can't be the one picking up. Some guilds provide a Hospitality sheet for the speaker to fill out for example about food choices, what they would be interesting to visit while in the city, etc. There is a sample of a contract on line at the SCCQG website if you want to compare contracts.

sewing threads. The teacher will also be bringing all she needs to conduct her class.


