1st VP Co-Chair Kathy Greene reported on upcoming programs/workshops.

Carolyn Lundie brought up that if we have a paid speaker in June, we would need more money for the speaker. This was due to adding Katsy Chappell for the May Program, After discussion, it was decided to research more non-cost options before voting on taking more money out of the budget.

2nd VP Sherry Delano gave updated information on the quilt show. She needs applications for vendors as soon as possible. She is trying to get a health permit for one weekend at no cost. Sherry needs Articles of Incorporation. Peggy Vachon will look for it. Advertising – our ad for \$150 in the Welcome Magazine gives us advertising for a full year so it is a good investment. As a guild we need to drop the discussion about 2nd Chance Fabrics (2nd Chance Fabrics wanted a full refund of their vendor space after canceling at the last minute. We gave them a refund of \$100.) She will meet with Mr. Johnson, an accountant, tomorrow to amend taxes as filed. Quilt Show meeting at Sherry DeLano's house, 2:00 on



Sunday, March 18. There are about 13 regular vendors currently which include: Stitchin' by the River, Dye Works and nine craft vendors. Nani Johnson will be vendor helper but cannot make it Sunday morning. Carolyn Lundie volunteered.

President Cheryl Nieman sent her embroidery file of the logo for the T-Shirts, which members have ordered. The other file was not in a correct format for the embroiderer.

Treasurer Peggy Vachon re-established that she needed to find the Articles of Incorporation. Sherry Delano stated that the Articles are needed to get a permit to sell food at the Quilt Show. A guild member would like someone to sell ice cream at the quilt show. There was a discussion about pros and cons of selling food at the quilt show. No conclusion was reached. Sherry D. has sent a letter requesting free parking for the quilt show. Sherry needs insurance for the fairground but must get a contract first.

Parliamentarian Donna Roberts stated that she does not have anyone running for parliamentarian. We cannot conduct business without a parliamentarian.

Publicity Jamie Harrington stated she had contacted the Jet Hawks representative and requested having a table for the Opportunity Quilt. The representative said we could purchase \$300 worth of tickets and sell tickets to double the money. After a discussion it was generally agreed that this was a bigger risk than it was worth.

New Business Peggy Vachon brought up that High Country Quilt Guild is selling 30 of their quilt frames for \$50 each. A discussion regarding the ease of using the frames, storage, and cost ensued. It was decided that we should arrange to see the racks before voting on this.

Carolyn Lundie wanted to verify that she was still purchasing a ladder for quilt show. Sherry Delano verified. Peggy Vachon wanted her to make sure it was a sturdy one and that Carolyn would check several places around town before purchasing. Carolyn agreed.

Meeting adjourned 7:28 pm.

It would be so great to have a quilt show with a little something of everyone. I can't make perfect quilts, but maybe we need to remember that finishing something is in itself an accomplishment. I am so proud of all of you! Let's show the AV what we can accomplish. You can send me something to enter for you if you are out of town. I can pick it up if you are close. Just get it in. — Nette Louton

Tip of the Month

Tackling Your Quilting UFOs

Here are some ideas on how to get the best mileage out of your unfinished projects:

- 1. First, pull out every project that is unfinished and take a good look at what you've got. Separate the projects into two piles: keep and donate. Only keep those projects that you feel you are capable of finishing and will want to hang/display when they are done. If you aren't going to show them off when they are finished, put them in the donate pile.
- 2. Organize a Trading UFOs night. Spend an evening sharing and trading unfinished projects, and you'll go home with some fun projects that you'll look forward to finishing. And better yet, your unwanted UFOs will find a good home!
- 3. Many charitable quilt groups would love your UFOs. [Donate to the Quilt Show Boutique!] They can take half-finished quilt tops and complete them, and then donate the finished quilt. Check your area for Project Linus groups or other charitable organizations. [Donate to AVQA Philanthropic!]
- 4. Do you have a UFO that was started so that you could learn a technique? If so, realize that learning a new quilting technique could be the end product

itself. If you got the hang of that technique toss your project or give it to a friend. We give you permission to throw it away and move on!



5. Depending on how many UFOs you have in your keep pile, sort them into finishing levels, from quick to lengthy. Then, plan to finish these projects like you'd finish a block of the month quilt—step-bystep. Place each project's components into a project pouch, then label with the anticipated finish date. Starting with the easiest-to-finish project, go shopping for any supplies you'll need to finish your project, and then get started! Don't move onto your next UFO until the first one is complete.

- 6. If you like the fabrics in a UFO but don't think you'd like the finished project, spend a little bit of time taking out the stitches and salvaging the fabric. You can always incorporate the cut pieces into a scrap quilt or design a fun pieced backing for a quilt with similar colors.
- 7. If you don't feel like taking out all the stitching in your blocks, use unfinished projects to practice your template-based or free-motion machine quilting. This gives meaning to your project, and you still have permission to toss it when you're done.

When all is said and done remember that it's just fabric and it doesn't have feelings (some of you may not agree with us on this point!) Instead of letting fabric and projects sit around and collect dust, start finishing them, donating them, and putting them to good use. You'll feel a sense of accomplishment once you conquer two or three UFOs, and when you do, you'll be ready to start shopping once again for new projects. The best part is: you'll be able to do your shopping guilt free!

Let's get those UFO's done!!!

Squares in Squares

Presented at the March 2018 Meeting

Due at the May 2018 Meeting

Finished Block: 12 ½ inch by 12 ½ inch



This block uses our background fabrics to make the stars. We will be using black or black on black and white or white fabrics.

Cutting instructions:

Black or Black on Black:

Cut eight 3-7/8 inch by 3-7/8 inch squares. Cut each square in half on the diagonal forming two triangles.

White or White on White:

Cut eight 3-7/8 inch by 3-7/8 inch squares. Cut each square in half on the diagonal forming two triangles.

How to assemble the block:

Now since we have the block cut out, it is time to look at the picture. Use it as a guide. Line up the triangles to form squares.

Sew on the diagonal with ¼ seam allowance. Do this without pulling the seams and press to the dark side. Line up the block with the picture. You may have to rotate some of the squares to make the picture.

Sew the rows together with ¼ seam allowance. Be precise so the rows will line up. Now sew the rows together to form your block. Spend some time matching seams to help the pattern to come out more clearly.

Remember, this is fun, so what happens, happens. You can improve on your next block!

2018 AVQA QUILT SHOW ENTRY RULES & JUDGING GUIDELINES

- 1. AVQA MEMBERS current as of January 1, 2018 may enter quilts for judging or exhibition only. AVQA MEMBERS who join after January 1, 2018 may enter quilts for exhibition only.
- 2. Quilts judged in previous AVQA shows cannot be entered again, except by invitation or exhibition, only.
- 3. Entrant must be the maker of the entry to be judged.
- 4. Multiple entries by the same entrant will be hung as space permits.
- 5. Each quilt entry requires a separate entry form with a photograph attached. The photograph may be of a quilt in progress (unfinished). Photo can be taken at the April meeting during the break.
- 6. DEADLINE FOR REGISTRATION IS THURSDAY, APRIL 12th. Entry forms will be published in the newsletter and electronic forms will be on the AVQA website. Forms will also be available at Guild meetings. **WE NEED YOUR ENTRY FORMS BY APRIL 12TH**.
- 7. Quilts must be finished, clean, and free of odors and pet hair.
- 8. A four-inch sleeve is required on all quilts except small quilts. Quilts wider than 110 inches cannot be hung on AVQA quilt stands unless folded and draped over the rod.
- 9. All quilts should have a cloth label sewn on the back. The entrant's name and the quilt's name should be included. Names on the quilts will be covered during judging.
- 10. Quilts that are to be judged must be delivered to the Lancaster United Methodist Church, 918 West Avenue J, Lancaster on Thursday, May 17, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. <u>only</u>. Exhibit Only quilts **may** be delivered during that time or to the Antelope Valley Fair Grounds Friday, May 18, between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Receipts will be provided with each entry. Alternate check-in arrangements may be made by contacting Sue Jacobsen.
- 11. The facility will be closed during the "take down" process of the show to all except to those who are working.
- 12. Quilts may be picked up at the checkout station between 5:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, May 20. BRING YOUR RECEIPT. For security purposes, entries may only be removed from the facility through the checkout station.

JUDGED QUILTS

GUIDELINES: Judges reserve the right to move, split, or combine categories dependent on number of entries received.

PIECED QUILT: A quilt is considered to be pieced if the piecing is predominant over all other techniques.

APPLIQUED QUILT: A quilt is considered to be machine appliqued if both machine and hand applique techniques are used. A quilt is considered to be hand appliqued when ALL of the applique work is done by hand.

MIXED TECHNIQUES QUILT: A combination of appliqué and piecing techniques are used to form the quilt top. Both techniques must contribute to the over-all design. The quilt must contain a noticeable & significant amount of both.

GROUP QUILT: A quilt with a top that has been constructed by two or more people. Examples of this type of quilt are round robin, block exchange, or a quilt made by a friendship circle.

SPECIALTY TECHNIQUES: Machine or hand quilted entries using predominantly specialty techniques such as cross stitch, embroidery including redwork, stenciling, painting, trapunto, whole cloth, crazy quilting, cathedral window, yo-yo, and rag quilts. This includes quilts that do not fit into the Applique or Pieced categories, and include quilts made using innovative techniques of construction, design and embellishment such as used in pictorial quilts, abstract quilts, Snippets, and quilts of original design using innovative piecing or applique techniques.

WEARABLE ART/OTHER Wearable Art: the piece must be intended to be worn as a garment or fashion accessory, i.e., hat, belt, purse, vest, scarf. The item must contain recognizable quilting. Other: this can include quilted items such as pillows, placemats, table runners, dolls and other stitched toys, tree skirts, Christmas stockings, sewing machine covers, and tea cozies.

FIRST TIME ENTRANT: This is the first time the member has entered a quilt for judging in an AVQA quilt show.
