QUILT SHOW: "Desert Blooms" dates are May 18th and May 19th, 2019. The hours are Saturday 10am-5pm and Sunday 10am-4pm.

<u>Calling all members</u>. We need your help to make this Quilt Show a success. Please volunteer at the show and also promote the show to your friends and family – get the word out!

We will meet at Budget Storage at 41943 10th Street W in Palmdale between Ave M & N on Friday May 17th at 7:00 am. The Storage unit is A- 19. Pickup trucks/vans are needed. We also need members/spouses/other family members to help to load Quilt Show items.

Quilt Show Setup is May 17th - taping starts at 8:00 am. Setup starts at 9:00 am and goes until we are finished. If you can give a full day or a few hours, all help will be appreciated.

Quilt Check-in: Items for Judging – check-in is 8:00 am to 9:45 am. Items for Exhibit only – check-in is 8:00 am – 2:00 pm. Please attach a 4-inch sleeve that is the width of the quilt. (See p. 9 if you need instructions.) Small quilts/wall-hangings can be pinned and therefore do not need a sleeve. Please see Sue Jacobsen.

Quilt Show Teardown is Sunday, May 19th starting at 4:00 pm until finished. Everyone is asked to pitch in and tear down the show – more helping hands means quicker teardown. Thanks!

Quilt Check-out will start at 5:00 PM and not before. Quilts will not be checked out until all quilts are taken down and accounted for.

Sign-ups for working the Quilt Show will be at the May Guild Meeting. Please sign up. We need help with Setup on Friday and Teardown on Sunday. During the show we need help with Security, Admissions, Opportunity Quilt, Raffle Baskets Sales, Auction, Boutique and Quilters Treasures, White Glove, and Vendor Helpers. Meet Friday the 17th at Budget Storage, 10th Street West at 7 a.m. to help load the quilt frames. The Quilt Show is next month. Signs have been placed on 30th and Ave. N as well as Ave. L and 50th St. West. Everyone's help is needed to make this show successful.

President Kathy Greene stated that help is needed from male relatives; please recruit helpers to set up and break down the quilt show.

Quilt Check-in/Sue Jacobsen thanked everyone for the great response for quilt entries. There are 94 entries at the current time. Members may turn in their UFO Challenge projects before the show. Quilt check-in for the show will be from 8-10 am on Friday at the fairgrounds. Judging will begin at 10:00 am.

Boutique and Scholarship/Karen Stocking's husband will try to help with the set-up of the boutique. She has the list for pricing fabric if a member needs it. Quilter's Treasures will take any donation. The Boutique is for hand-crafted, handmade items. Call Karen and she will pick up donations. Also, she needs members to volunteer

Quilt Show Auction/Corinne Gurney showed two items that have been donated for the auction. Twenty items a day are needed for the 2-day auction.

Show and Share



The regular board meeting of the AVQA was called to order at Kathy Greene's house on April 23, 2019 at 6:37 p.m. President Kathy Greene being in the chair and Carolyn Lundie acting as secretary.

Minutes: The minutes of the March Board Meeting were approved as published in the April newsletter. Motion proposed, seconded and passed.

President/1st Vice President Kathy Greene is looking forward to the changeover board meeting and the upcoming class by Norah McMeeking in June. There will be a \$2.00/per person additional fee for the crossover board meeting at Greenhouse Cafe at 6:00 pm. The fee will be paid by the programs budget. There will be an Open Sew in May, but participants must sign up if going. If no sign-ups, the Open Sew will be canceled. Coral Brown cannot be there.

Incoming Programs Nette Louton and Pat Crook have planned a fun year of programs. One plan is to use members to teach classes on techniques such as ruler work and paper piecing.

Kathy Greene for Jamie Harrington/2nd Vice President No report provided by Jamie Harrington. Kathy said Quilty Pleasures is wondering why their check for the reservation of a vendor space has not been cashed. After questioning relevant members regarding the check, no answer could be given.

Treasurer Peggy Vachon said that any receipts for the Louise Huff donation should have been issued by the treasurer. Following a discussion regarding the missing check and the Louise Huff receipt, Kathy Greene tabled both issues until the next meeting.

Friendship Groups Nette Louton will contact all friendship group leaders to see if their groups are open to new members or not. She said she would put it in the newsletter.

Kathy Judkins reminded everyone that a new newsletter person will be needed if we are to have a newsletter in July.

Peggy Vachon replied, yes. Kathy asked if the instructions for a quilt sleeve should be published in the newsletter. Discussion ensued. Deadline for newsletter articles is April 28.

Quilt Show Publicity

If you think of a place where we can put bookmarks, please let me know and I'll take or mail them to those places.

How to Make a 4-inch Hanging Sleeve for Your Quilt

(adapted from thesprucecrafts.com)

A quilt hanging sleeve can be permanent or temporary and it can be sewn on after or at the same time you apply binding.

To add before binding the quilt:

- 1. Cut or piece together fabric to make a strip 9" tall and the same width as the quilt.
- 2. Fold under short edges ½", wrong sides together. Fold under again. Press. Sew a straight or zigzag seam to hem the folds.
- 3. Fold the strip lengthwise, wrong sides together, aligning raw edges.
- 4. Center the folded strip along the top edge of the quilt, against the backing, aligning its matched raw edges with the edge of the quilt.
- 5. Sew the sleeve to the quilt with an approximate 1/8' seam allowance.
- 6. Bind the quilt as you normally would.
- 7. Smooth the sleeve downward along the quilt backing and then make a ½" fold along its length to create a pleat. Leaving the pleat intact, pin the sleeve bottom to the quilt.

- 8. Whipstitch the lower edge of the sleeve to the quilt. Remove pins. The sleeve will pooch out a bit to allow space for a hanging rod.
- 9. Whipstitch the (short) back sides of the sleeve to the quilt. Leave the front sides unsewn to allow for rod insertion.

To add after binding the quilt:

Follow steps 1-3 above.

- 4. Sew raw edges together with a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance. Press the seam allowance open.
- 5. Place the open seam against the quilt's back. Center and pin the top edge of the tube to the back of the quilt, about ½" below the binding.
- 6. Use a whipstitch to sew the top edge of the tube to the quilt backing. Stitch into the quilt batting occasionally to help strengthen the seam, but do not allow the stitches to show on the front of the quilt.

Follow steps 7-9 above.
