Lauretta Crites is an inspiring Speaker, Pattern Designer, and an award-winning Art Quilter. After graduating from California Institute of the Arts (CalArts) with a degree in Costume Design she spent several years with Center Theater Group creating elaborate costumes for major Los Angeles theater productions, followed by 10 years with the Los Angeles Opera as Assistant Costume Director, traveling and working on exquisite productions in some of the most celebrated theaters in the world.

Burnt out on late nights and long theater hours, she left the Opera and began to let her new-found passion for quilting take over her life, home, and studio. Her love of textiles and costume merged into art quilting, where she frequently gets to “costume” the characters in her quilts, playing once again with silks and satins along with the quilting cottons.

Lauretta has appeared on Quilting Arts TV and Huell Howser’s “California Gold.” Her Art Quilts have been published in *Quilters Newsletter Magazine*, *IQA Journal*, *Quilting Arts Magazine* and The Quilt Show e-Newsletter, winning awards at IQA Houston Festival, The Road to California, Pacific International Quilt Festival and more. When not traveling the country speaking and teaching the joy of quilting, she’s at home working in her studio or hanging out with her husband and her dogs, Lilo and Stitch.

General Meeting Minutes
January 11, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by **President Nani Johnson** at Lancaster United Methodist Church with **AVQA Secretary, Kathy Judkins**, taking the minutes.

President Nani Johnson welcomed everyone and reminded those who brought items for the “free table” to retrieve any items remaining on the table after the meeting.

Minutes: President Johnson. Nani asked if there were any corrections or changes to the November General Meeting minutes as reported in the January newsletter. There being none, a motion was made to accept the November minutes and the motion was seconded. The motion carried.

Treasurer’s Report/Lynn Aguirre: The bank statements have been reconciled from October through December. She is now able to run the financial reports and ran an updated statement of activity for the newsletter. Stephanie Shuping has filed the nonprofit raffle report required by the State of California for the year ending 12/31/2023. Deposited funds received from the holiday luncheon of \$500.

1st VP/Maggie Konik: On February 8th, we will have a lecture and trunk show, “Align Your FMQ Stars,” by Karen Miller (via Zoom) from Redbird Quilt Company. There will be a discount coupon for the Redbird Quilt Co. Online Shop. On February 10th, we will have an all-guild sew-in to practice free-motion quilting or to work on your own project at Quartz Hill Library from 10:00 to 2:00. On March 14th, we will have an in-person lecture and trunk show, “Picture This? How to Create Pictorial Art Quilts,” by Laretta Crites. We will have an all guild sew-in at Harshfield Terrace on March 16th from 10:00 to 2:00.

2nd VP/VACANT: We need a 2nd VP or a team. Leinaala Strickler talked about some of the things she is looking into for fundraising.

Parliamentarian/Nancy Walker: Nancy read a list of objections to the proposed bylaws changes. A group of members submitted this list, and it will be published in the February newsletter along with the Bylaws Review Committee’s proposed changes.

Membership /Sue Jacobsen: There are 30 members present; one guest, Christiana Han; and one returning member, Lois Rose.

Opportunity Quilt/Kathy Judkins: Terri Moss has finished quilting, binding, and putting a sleeve on the opportunity quilt. We will display it and sell raffle tickets at the Road to California Quilt Show on January 20th. The opportunity quilt was shown to the guild. President Nani Johnson announced that Sue Jacobsen and Terri Moss have volunteered to design and make the 2024-25 Opportunity Quilt.

Door Prizes/Kathy Greene: Nette Louton won the door prize.

Fat Quarter Drawing/Robynn Frame: Nani Johnson won the drawing and chose purple to be the color for February.

Newsletter/Peggy Vachon spoke briefly about the importance of keeping a cell phone with you. It can save your life.

Philanthropic/Kathy Judkins: Thank you to everyone who gave me finished tops and quilts at the meeting, and to the philanthropic committee members who come to sew on the first Saturday of the month at Harshfield Terrace.

Publicity/Leinaala Strickler: She will have tri-fold brochures and business cards at our raffle quilt table at Road to California.

Sunshine/Peggy Cruz: Please let her know if you know of any member who is sick or has passed away so that she can send a card.

New Business: Donna Roberts made a motion that we will not have a quilt show this year. Sue Jacobsen seconded the motion. There was discussion that included the date and place proposed by the board for holding the drawing for the 2024 Opportunity Quilt: September 12, 2024, at the guild

meeting. By show of hands, most of the members voted not to have the show this year.

President Nani Johnson said she thought everybody had a good time playing the Left, Right and Center game after the January meeting. She also said that Nancy Walker gave a good presentation of the proposed Bylaws changes.

Minutes: **President Nani Johnson** asked if anyone had changes to make to the November board meeting minutes. There being none, she asked for a motion to approve them. Kathy Greene made a motion to approve the November board meeting minutes and Donna Roberts seconded the motion.

Lynn said the Habit is offering fundraisers. Leinaala will check with the Habit for possible dates. Leinaala said car shows may be good places to do fundraisers.

Old Business: Kathy Greene still has the Grace frame. She will send another article for the newsletter and Leinaala will put it on Facebook Marketplace if no one in the guild is interested.

New Business: Nancy Walker said we have several vacant positions, and she said she will be the Travel chairman.

Motion to adjourn by Nancy Walker. Seconded by Leinaala Strickler.
