NEW FRIENDSHIP GROUPS: Calling all New Members and Wannabees!

If you are new in the guild, or even if you have been around for a while, it can sometimes be tricky to get to know other quilters in the guild.

How to Get to Know Other Members:

One of the ways to get to know other members is to become a member of a Friendship Group. This is a group that meets on a regular basis - some meet once a month - others meet semi-weekly or weekly - to talk about quilts, make quilts, and generally, just to spend a few hours with other people who share your obsession with all things "Quilty". The members of each group decide the hows, whens, wheres and whys of their group.

What Do Friendship Groups Do?

I have had the great pleasure to be a member of the 'mini group' "Loose Threads" for 15 years. Over the years we have participated in a 'round robin' quilt exchange where we each made a center block and each month a different person took it home to add another border - and got back a completed quilt top; we have made several group quilts where we each made the same block six times and traded, each ending up with our own quilt of six different blocks (one year our theme was Christmas; another year, we hand-dyed fabric and made flower blocks); another year we volunteered as a group to make the 'winner' ribbons for a local quilt show; and sometimes, if we are feeling lazy, we just get together and do lunch! Friendship groups can do Anything they want to do!

Quilts Taken to Tornado Victims in Joplin, Missouri

Kathy Judkins and I took five quilts to the Law Offices of Kristof and Kristof in Pasadena for delivery to Joplin, Missouri. Two of the quilts were made by AVQA members for the Hurricane Katrina Disaster. There were three unsuccessful attempts to get these quilts to the victims of Hurricane Katrina but they have now found a home with the tornado victims in Joplin. Two child-sized quilts were donated by Mary Brewer and one twin-sized quilt was donated by me. Below are a picture and a thank you from Denise Kristof who organized the collection and delivery of quilts.



This short note is to express my sincere appreciation for your participation in my Call For Quilts For Tornado Victims in Joplin, Missouri. Your unhesitating support was truly awesome. I remain truly overwhelmed by everyone's generosity and selflessness.

We assembled/collected approximately 200 fabulous quilts. Fabric Patch in Montclair donated 60 beautiful pillowcases. Some people drove 45 minutes to 90 minutes one way to deliver their beautifully handcrafted treasures.

My son, my daughter-in-law, and I drove approximately 3200 miles round trip to Missouri and back nonstop in about 72 hours.

We delivered the quilts to the First Episcopalian Church in Carthage, Missouri -just 10 miles from Joplin. Relief workers had been meeting at that church to receive direction from Americorp, FEMA, and National Guard. They used the kitchen at that church daily to prepare meals for distribution.

Fortunately members of the First Episcopalian Church had formed a quilt guild. So, they appreciated the quilts we delivered. While we were en route back home, we received word that members had already sorted and tagged the quilts and begun distribution to those in need. A note was enclosed with each quilt explaining who made the quilt.

During our brief stay in Missouri we toured the wreckage. Even though we were prevented from stopping by patrolling police officers, we were able to see enough to appreciate the devastation and be certain that your gifts of quilts are necessary and will most assuredly be appreciated.

Thank you sincerely for making all this possible.

The meeting was called to order at 6:50 p.m. by Lois Rose, President. She thanked everyone for serving on the board. Members in attendance were Lois Rose, Sandy Smith, Jamie Harrington, Sue Jacobsen, Karen Stenback, Corine Gurney, Sue Hartman, Pat Stauning, Sylvia Darroch, Michelle Johnston and Sandi Borowiak.

The May board meeting minutes were approved as reported in the newsletter.

The treasurer, Pat Stauning, reported the amount previously reported for the raffle baskets was correct in the May Treasurer report. The treasurer's books are in balance as of the July turnover.

Jamie Harrington, 1st Vice President, reported there was a \$356 profit from Trash and Treasure. Sandy Huzar has indicated her willingness to serve as 2nd Vice President. Her name will be added to the list of candidates to be voted on by the members in July. Upcoming speakers will be Anne Copeland for July. Lynn Mann, Marguette Tate and Sue Handley will be speakers in 2012.

Sue Jacobsen, 2nd Vice President, gave a final quilt show profit of \$5,168.64. Sue will be our web master this coming year. She has posted quilt show home tour pictures. A yearly fee of \$147.99 is due in July to our web page carrier, Homestead. Sue and her husband are researching information for a new cordless microphone and speaker system for our guild.

Corinne Gurney, Parliamentarian, needs to fill the positions of publicity, holiday party, opportunity quilt design for 2012-2013, and door prizes. Lucille Bell has volunteered for philanthropic and Betty Putzka for veteran's quilts.

Corinne indicated there are still 14 spaces left on the bus for the Long Beach Quilt Show. There was discussion as to whether to purchase the remaining 14 tickets by the guild in hopes of selling the tickets. The guild will purchase those tickets. It was decided that in the budget for 2011-2012, \$100 would be included for travel should this occur in the future.

Pat Stauning, treasurer, and the board, went line by line on the budget proposal for 2011-2012. Each item was discussed and a final budget was submitted. Sue Jacobsen moved we accept and budget with the revisions. Sandy Smith seconded the motion. This budget will be presented to the general membership for discussion and final vote in July.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:15p.m.

And thanks to those who helped vacuum the vendor building.

Jamie Harrington has reserved space at the Market Place for next year's quilt show.

Corinne Gurney indicated the guild is still in need of a 2nd Vice President, hospitality, philanthropic and holiday party persons for the coming year. Think about volunteering. You won't be doing this alone. There are always people who are willing to assist.

Anne Copeland is our speaker for July. She is a quilt appraiser. They are asking that you only bring one quilt to be appraised. This is only a verbal appraisal. If you want a written appraisal there will be a fee.

Patti Keene encouraged 8 more people to sign-up for the Big Bear Retreat, Oct.21-24. The cost is \$275 which includes room, board and snacks. Per room/4 persons.

Sandy Jo Ellis reminded us that sign-ups for white glove and sale of AVQA quilt raffle tickets are needed for Long Beach Quilt Show. Bus space is still available for \$15 which includes the bus trip and entry to the show. Great deal.

Kaye Hague showed the quilt she put together from the scraps she shared in January. She thanked all the members who assembled and returned their pieces.
