Meeting was called to order at 6:37 pm with President Kathy Greene being in the chair and Carolyn Lundie acting as Secretary.

The President reminded everyone to turn off cell phones and place purses and bags under chairs and to put away chairs after the meeting. Keep walkways clear.

FREE TABLE: If you bring an item for the free table, check back at the end of the evening to collect any items left on the table. Please make a donation if you feel you got some great items. The funds collected are used to buy gifts for the membership drawings.

Minutes: Pat Stauning moved to accept the general meeting minutes as published in the newsletter. Seconded by Sue Jacobsen. Motion approved.

Treasurer's Report: Lynn Aguirre moved to accept the Treasurer's report as published in the newsletter. Seconded by Peggy Campbell. Motion approved.

The next board meeting will be September 17 at Bolts in the Bathtub at 5:30 pm. All are welcome. According to the By-Laws, standing committee members are particularly encouraged to attend.

1st Vice President Co-Chair/Nette Louton reported on a notable sign seen on a recent trip which stated, "It is not about the ribbons, it is about showing your work to the rest of the world."

Elizabeth Eastman will present "An Undercover Traditional Modern Quilter" tonight. She will teach free motion quilting on September 14. Nette gave the supplies needed for the workshop. Lunch can be purchased for \$5 from Nette. She announced that the Two for One Mini Crossroads Block can be bought on Elizabeth Eastman's web site. Members need to bring a mug rug to share and a cup and saucer to the October 10th Membership Tea. Wear a flamboyant hat to the tea as well. Friendship groups are encouraged to bring a centerpiece for a table.

Tiffany Hayes is scheduled to teach the workshop, "Delta Quilt," on October 19. However, Nette will

ask Tiffany to change the date due to the conflict with the Fall Retreat. November 14 is **Quilter's College**.

Katherine Stocking-Lopez described the Three Layers Quilt Show to be put on by AVQA. It will be held at the Antelope Valley Art Gallery, 939 E. Ave-12 Ste. 168, Palmdale on November 16, 2019 through January 26, 2020. Members are asked to bring their art quilts to the October meeting and to submit an art quilt for a challenge to be exhibited at the quilt show. Criteria for the challenge is an original, two-color only quilt, maximum size 16" x 16". A handout was distributed with the criteria for submitting art quilts and challenge quilts.

2nd Vice President Jamie Harrington requested donations for the auction at the quilt show. Baskets are needed from Friendship Circles. Please advertise the quilt show on any available social media. Yvonne Rodriguez and Pat Stauning have placed flyers and bookmarks for the quilt show on one of the side tables. Quilts for the art show do not have to be from the current year.

Librarian and Block Party/Corine Cudney asked members to check out books from the library and return books if any are overdue. The Block Party will continue another month. A member may turn in as many blocks for the Block Party as desired. There is no limit. She requested a mixture of fish on each block for visual interest.

UFO Challenge/Corinne Gurney described the design for the 2020-21 Opportunity Quilt. As the quilt is a collage quilt, Corinne asked members to bring any fabric motif that reminds them of the United States. Questions were fielded regarding the type of motifs wanted. The By-Laws committee is working on corrections. Next month's UFO is #1.

Minutes: The motion to approve the minutes as published was proposed by Stephanie Shuping and seconded by Corinne Gurney. Motion passed.

President's Report/Kathy Greene thanked everyone for doing a great job and stated that all is going well with the guild.

Program Co-Chair Nette Louton stated that Elizabeth Eastman was a very pleasant workshop presenter. She gave a handout that was very beneficial for the workshop. Nette listed the programs and workshops through January as stated at the September General Meeting with a couple of changes. "Delta Quilt" has been moved back to Oct. 12 to accommodate those planning on attending the Fall Retreat. The workshop cost is \$30 and Tiffany will have jelly rolls available to sell. Email Nette if you want to register for the class. For the November Quilter's College, a person is needed to speak on bindings and batting. December will be the holiday party and in January, Rami Kim will speak and present a workshop.

Treasurer Stephanie Shuping reported that we received six months of newsletter advertising from Shaff and Harrington. A committee met on Aug. 19 at Stephanie Shuping's house to conduct an audit of the financial books for the last two years. Betty Putzka and Donna Roberts reviewed the financial records from two years ago. Cheryl Nieman and Pat Stauning reviewed the records from last year. Most of the irregularities were found in discrepancies between documentation for check requests and checks written. She has organized the treasurer's files for easier access.

2nd Vice President Jamie Harrington/Quilt Show sent out more vendor applications. She will start quilt show meetings in January. She needs someone to do quilt check-in for the quilt show.

Parliamentarian, Travel and Opportunity Quilt Design/Corinne Gurney reported that she will put a group together to help her organize the storage. As **Parliamentarian** she needs to verify the inventory. Jamie Harrington said to throw away the white tablecloths. Nette said she would like to use them for the Membership Tea. The UFO Challenge will end in February. Nothing will be due in December. All participants will receive a charm. **Travel:** She is researching trips to Glendale and Long Beach. She doesn't know if Eleanor Burns will be giving a presentation this year. **Opportunity Quilt:** The quilt will be queen-sized and she likes Steam-a-Seam 2® for adhering the motifs.

Challenge/Nette Louton The Challenge will be launched in November and due in April.

AVQA Art Show/Jamie Harrington The flyer for the art show will be put on Facebook. Quilts will be on exhibit through the length of the exhibit. If you want to help with selling tickets for the Opportunity Quilt, email Donna Roberts. If you want to sell a quilt, 30% of the proceeds will be donated to the gallery. For the Boutique, 25% will go to the gallery. No percentage will be charged on Opportunity tickets. Art quilts for the exhibit are due in October. Challenge quilts for the exhibit are due in November. Criteria for exhibit quilts and challenge quilts will be on the AVQA Facebook site and avqa.org. Bring dowels if exhibiting smaller quilts. They will have racks for larger quilts. She

needs someone to do demos during the exhibit. An exhibit is needed to show our philanthropic participation. An Art Exhibit Opening Reception will be Nov. 23. Twenty-five dollars will come from the emergency fund for the site fee. Insurance is not needed.

Challenge/Nette Louton said the kits will be available at the November general meeting. The guild challenge will be to make a quilt from the time of the Suffragettes of purple and gold fabric only. She needs white tablecloths for the tea. After discussion, she will get people to bring tablecloths. Set-up for the tea will be 4:00 at the Methodist Church.

Publicity Chair Yvonne Rodriguez and Pat Stauning Yvonne posted the art show flyers and the Rosamond Quilt Show to our two Facebook sites as well as the Quilt Show Facebook site. She submitted the art show info to eventcrazy.com, Quiltguilds.com and Eventbrite.com. Yvonne also emailed Bobbi Keay with Lancaster City website for the calendar of events and emailed Jim Mylner with Palmdale City website for their calendar of events. Pat added that she will put the Quilt Show info in May's Lifestyle of the AV Press for \$125. She will try to put it in the Welcome Edition of the AV Press as well, but it may be too late. Yvonne concluded that packets for the quilt show had been put together to give to Vicki Brown for the October SCCQG meeting.

New Business

Yvonne Rodriguez requested that her last name be spelled correctly in the newsletter and on the website, R-o-d-r-i-g-u-e-z. President Kathy Greene asked that retiring board members write up a brief synopsis of their position. Nette Louton will write something for October.

Opportunity Quilt2020/2021

"Celebrating the USA"

The quilt has been started and I hope to have the flag part done to show at the next meeting. I do apologize for it appears I did not adequately explain what I meant or need for motifs. I have included a picture of some. Motifs are basically a "picture" of something on the fabric that can be cut out and applied to something else, such as a flower. If you are familiar with Laura Heine patterns, that is what I am talking about. I did receive fabrics with motifs on them last month, but not very many. We are going to need between 100 and 200 motifs to fill this quilt. These can be anything including flowers, bugs, cats, dogs, sayings, and especially things pertaining to the USA i.e. flags, state flowers, Statue of Liberty, trees, bugs, etc. You do not have to completely cut them out but if you can add fusible web (preferably Steam a Seam 2) to the back of them, that would be a big help. You can bring any size of motif/picture, but please try to keep it close to 5" square. I just need the picture, not the full yardage. Also, please bring only **quilt shop quality fabrics** (this means not from JoAnn's, Hobby Lobby or Wal-Mart). You can contribute as many as you want to.

The kits are almost ready to be put together for the log cabin blocks for the border. I hope to have them at the October meeting. If you have any questions, or need clarification, please contact Corinne Gurney. If you would like to be part of the process when the collaging part will be done, please let her know also.

Challenge

We have not forgotten. The challenge will come out with all information at the November meeting. As always, for this fun challenge you will be requested to pay \$5.00 for the kit and instructions. There will be only 24 kits available. First come first serve!

UFO Challenge

The next number for the UFO Challenge is **1**. Great job for everyone who finishes a quilt each month and even to those who are trying to. The basket is just about ready to be revealed for that will be given away after this list is completed. We decided to take the month of December off, so the number that is drawn in November will be due at the January meeting. - Make a 2-color quilt (you can use shades and tints of your two colors)
- Maximum size: 16" square
- Must be your original design!
- No patterns allowed. Public domain historic patterns permitted, but we would really like to you to step out of the box and really create something truly unique!
- A hanging sleeve must be attached to the back of the quilt
- Maximum of 3 entries per member
- You may list your quilt for sale; AVA gets 25% of listing price.
- Challenge quilts are due by the November AVQA meeting

Exhibition Quilts:

- Quilts MUST be 100% original work:
 - No patterns or kits
- No larger than 60"x60"
- Pieces must be quilted
 - Wearable arts must be "quilted"
- Any subject is allowed:
 - Examples:
 - Modern, deconstructed, exploration of patterns and scale, color, texture, whole quilt, art quilts, etc.
- Quilts for exhibition are due at the October AVQA Meeting



SOMETHING SMELLS FISHY

For this block you can have one to four fish. Use blue for the background and choose your favorite color for your fish. If you make more than one fish, you could use another color for the next fish.

Cutting Instructions for the fish, finished size 6 ½ by 6 ½”

Fish color

Cut one 7” X 7” square, cut on the diagonal. You only use one triangle of these per fish.

Cut one 4”X 4” square, cut on the diagonal. You only use one triangle of these per fish.

Blue color

Cut two 4”X 4” squares, cut on the diagonal. You only use three triangles per fish.

To Assemble the Block

Now since we have the block cut out, it is time to look at the picture.

First sew the three triangles together and press out from the middle triangle.

Now sew on the last blue triangle to the middle triangle’s long side and press out from the middle triangle.

Next sew the two triangles together forming a fish

Finally trim your square to 6 ½ X 6 ½

To Assemble the Blue Part of your Block

One 12 ½ X 6 ½” rectangle.

Up to two 6 ½ X 6 ½ square. If you are making one fish.

If you are making two fish you will use the 12 ½ X 6 ½ rectangle or two 6 ½ X 6 ½ squares or if you make three fish you will need one 6 ½ X 6 ½ square Finally if you make a block with four fish, you can skip this step and just sew the four fishy squares together.

Turn this block on POINT when you are done with it!!!
