We have Colourwerx with us tonight, Linda and Carl Sullivan. They live in Palm Desert. She has great colors there and patterns. Her presentation was given before the business meeting.

Linda mentioned color apps to help pick palettes. These were Design-Seeds.com (a website), Color Inspiration Tool, and Pocket Palette.

This Saturday we will have a Sew-In via Zoom from 9am to 11am. You can do cutting, sewing, whatever you would like to work on. We are trying this to see how the technology works to do this. Pat will send a Zoom link to all members so they can join if they want to or not.

We are looking at different things for next month. She is not sure yet what it will be.

2nd VP Quilt Show/Jamie Harrington

Minutes of AVQA Board Meeting Feb 16, 2021

Attending the meeting were Kathy Greene, Corinne Gurney, Jamie Harrington, Nette Louton, Pat Crook, Stephanie Shuping.

The meeting was called to order at 4:07 pm. Kathy Greene, President presiding, Corinne Gurney as Secretary. We meet via Zoom.

President's Welcome/Kathy Greene

Approvals

The minutes for the January meeting were moved for acceptance as entered in the February newsletter. Moved by Nette Louton 1st, Jamie Harrington 2nd. Approved.

President's Message/Kathy Greene

We all have questions, concerns with what is going on, but we are all in the same boat. She is concerned about the elections in April. Stephanie has agreed to be treasurer for at least another year, possibly. The by-laws do allow for that. We appreciate the stability she has given to our finances. As per the direction of SCCQG, if people do not step up to the open positions, the existing officers will stay in place. The other concern is the quilt show in May. We could possibly postpone it until October or November. Time will tell. We will play this by ear. The decision doesn't have to be made until April what to do. So far, we have spent about \$400.00 on it.

Another issue is the question of membership and what to do about next year's dues. One suggestion is to charge the \$30.00, but to give each member \$10.00 worth of opportunity tickets or some other item. We only made \$4200 in income besides the membership dues this year.

We discussed the opportunity quilt that should have been raffled last year. Stephanie stated we made about \$1800 so far. She checked with the state about our gambling license and they stated it would be okay to delay having the raffle due to the pandemic. We need to find ways to market the opportunity quilt tickets. Do we want to keep the same quilt going until we can finally start making money on it again? We will discuss later what to do about that.

1st VP Programs/Nette Louton

We are going to have a block of the month. It will be going into the newsletter. It will be up to the individual as to how much fabric they want to use. They can make it scrappy if they want. People can share their blocks on our Facebook page. We discussed if our page is private. We have more persons on it than members. We need to check who is allowing nonmembers on it. This is one of the perks of being a member. We need to make it more appealing to be a member and not make everything available online. We also need to be aware of not putting our treasurer's report on line.

She is not sure what we are doing next month. She is looking at how to photograph your quilts, possibly thread painting. She will be sticking with lectures for

the next few months. The sew-in went well. She is hoping to do it bi-monthly. We need to keep up with the phone calls.

We talked about doing an article for the newsletter for a "Quilter of the Month." It should not be a board member. Corinne suggested contacting Sue Jacobsen. Nette will call her.

2nd VP Quilt Show/Jamie Harrington

Nothing has changed since Thursday, so everything is status quo. We will be having a Zoom meeting next week on Tuesday, the 23rd. We discussed starting at an earlier time. We will start at 6:00pm. Pat will send a Zoom invitation. Jamie will put a notice on Facebook as well to encourage members to attend.

Treasurer's Report/Stephanie Shuping

She is running the report from the beginning of the fiscal year. We are doing well right now. She commented on the \$2600 that has been held for retreats deposits. It was confirmed that most of the people are still wanting to go in August, so we won't have to worry about having to give the money back yet. We are still playing it by ear.

Secretary's Report/Corinne Gurney

Corinne discussed mail she has received that has not been distributed. None of it was necessary for guild business so it will be recycled.

The UFO challenge is still going. Hopefully we will be able to meet in person before this list ends.

Parliamentarian/Sandy Smith

No report.

Membership/Pat Crook

She liked the idea of giving something back to members this year since they did not get a full advantage of their membership. She suggested we need to consider using PayPal or other options to take payments.

She was asked about the directory. She will put together an Excel file and send it out so people can have the information. She will send it out once it is done.

We also need to nail down the issue of mailing out the newsletter and the amount of dues being paid for mailing it. This will have to be taken care of in the next by-laws review. You cannot charge the extra \$10.00 unless the by-laws are changed. She will need to contact the Parliamentarian to discuss making this change.

Nette brought up creating an option for paying for membership if we cannot meet and they unable to send a check. That way, they are able to make the payment. This will be discussed at a future date.

New Business/Kathy Greene

We discussed the bereavement quilts that Lynell Rodio has been making for Antelope Valley Hospital with the help of members of a church in Palmdale. Nette brought up that we will be mailing valentines to members not attending the Zoom meetings. This will come out of her budget. Carla has received enough volunteers to make them.
