The November program will be a Quilter's College with a Philanthropic Sew-In at Mayflower Gardens. She is taking sign-ups. December will be dark, and on Jan. 8<sup>th</sup>, Cheryl Nieman will present the New York Beauty workshop at Mayflower Gardens. Cost is \$30. Email Pat if you're attending the class.

All basket donations will be appreciated. Diane Grooms will be taking items starting in January 2022 until before the quilt show in May. The Auction Entry Form will be online at the AVQA Website. Items are needed for the Quilt Auction, such as quilts, wall hangings, kits, placemats, table runners, purses, totes, unfinished quilts and blocks. The chair position for the Boutique/Ouilters Treasures is vacant. Please let Jamie know If you are interested in holding this position. Members may sell handmade items at the Boutique & Quilters Treasures booth. The guild will deduct a small fee for the sale. If you have any questions on the B&QT, ask Jamie. Approximately 50 yards of fabric was used to make borders, backings, and binding for quilt tops that were sent to Susanville, CA. **Meeting called to order** 5:37 pm, via Zoom by President Donna Roberts being in the chair. Carolyn Lundie acting as secretary.

**Minutes:** The September minutes published in the newsletter were approved following a motion proposed by Kathy Greene and seconded by Jamie Harrington.

**Presidents Report/Donna Roberts** stated that it's nice to see everyone and she wished she could have been here to go to the Table Sale. The money from

the Table Sale will be used to offset the Programs Budget.

Programs/Pat Crook This week-end's Table Sale was a success with \$450 in contributions and table rentals. Kathy Greene, Peggy Campbell and Kathy Judkins donated their proceeds, and Dixie Bahr gave a donation. The December program will be a Quilter's College presented with YouTube videos. The Philanthropic Sew-In on Nov. 13 will be at Mayflower Gardens II from 9 am - 1 pm. Bring your own lunch. Cheryl Nieman's New York Beauty class will be at Mayflower Gardens II January 15 from 9 am - 3 pm.

**Quilt Show/Publicity: Jamie Harrington** is sending out more vendor applications which is typical this time of the year. Jazz II Sewing & Quilting Machine made \$150 last Saturday at the Table Sale.

Treasurer's Report/Stephanie Shuping discussed the Income and Expenses report with the board and will make a couple of changes before submitting in the newsletter. Currently, the budget is in the red. Stephanie paid the SCCOG insurance costs on 89 members. She ordered the insurance certificates which show we are insured within the meeting places we use. SCCQG needs copies of agreements the guild has with LUMC and AVOIC stating those are our meeting places for insurance reasons. Stephanie was advised to contact the secretary of LUMC or Pat Stauning. Jamie Harrington stated that AVOIC hadn't required proof in the past. The new raffle fee of \$20 was paid and Stephanie received our raffle license for 2021-2022. COVID-19 restrictions prevented an audit of the financial accounts for the 2020-21 fiscal year. Stephanie requested combining the past 2 years into one audit and conducting the audit after the quilt show. President Roberts agreed with her suggestions. The was no dissent.

Parliamentarian/Pat Crook for Nette Louton The next By-Laws Revision meeting will be 9:00 am Oct. 30<sup>th</sup> at Nette's. The goal will be to propose the revisions in By-Laws in time to vote on the changes at the January general meeting.

Philanthropic/Kathy Judkins \$210 worth of fabric donated by Marlena Sutton's estate was sold at the Table Sale on Saturday. Sue Jacobsen and Peggy Campbell have been quilting a lot of philanthropic quilts. The next Sew-In at Mayflower gardens will focus on philanthropic quilts, but members can work on anything they want. Kathy will have philanthropic quilt kits to pick up at Mayflower gardens. The room will hold up to 20 people with machines, but pin-basting is a particular need. Kathy will look for something to protect tables from the pins.

Web Page/Door Prize/Raffle Baskets: Kathy Greene The Auction Entry Form has been updated as well as other items on web page. Kathy is encouraging individuals to donate a basket for the raffle and door prizes as well. People with businesses might consider donating a basket to promote their products.

to work on, or you can help reduce the Philanthropic Committee's stash and make a child's holiday season a little warmer by working on philanthropic quilts. When you sign up with Pat, please let her know if you prefer to piece, cut batting, pin-baste, quilt, or bind. Thank you to Paula Kelley Dyer for making arrangements for us to use this room and to Nette Louton for putting this on the schedule! Please note that the State of California requires masks for unvaccinated people and recommends them for everyone in indoor public places like meetings.

Lots of help and donations from Michelle Johnston, and fabric donated by Marlena Sutton's family, made it possible for us to contribute 4 completed quilts, 16 tops with backings and binding, and 1 top with backing to the quilt collection for the Dixie Fire survivors. We used 14 of the larger quilts from the Philanthropic stash and added borders to most of them to make them the generous throw-size that was requested.

On behalf of AVQA, I also donated 9 quilts and 2 flannel blankets to the Children's Center in Lancaster on September 29.
