


DECEMBER PROGRAM

Meeting was **called to order** at 6:36 pm by President, Donna Roberts via Zoom. Carolyn Lundie acting as secretary.

President Donna Roberts welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Minutes: Minutes: The October minutes were approved as published in the November newsletter. Peggy Campbell proposed the motion, seconded by Cheryl Nieman.

Treasurer's Report was approved as published in the November newsletter with Cheryl Nieman proposing the motion and a second by Nette Louton.

The next **board meeting** is **November 16** via Zoom at 5:30 pm. Pat Crook will be sending the Zoom link.

1st Vice President Co-Chair/Programs: Pat Crook No programs scheduled for December. Sue Jacobsen will give a virtual trunk show for the January program via Zoom. Cheryl Nieman will teach the New York Beauty pattern on Jan 8, which is the weekend before the general meeting. Cost is \$30. Send Pat your name if you're attending. 2nd Vice President/Quilt Show: \$150 was made on the Baby Lock Jazz machine raffle at our table sale in Oct. Jamie exchanged vendor info with Ridgecrest Quilt Show Chair. Ridgecrest Quilt Show is March 2022. We have been given the opportunity to show and sell tickets for our opportunity quilt. Jamie verified that she will have the Jazz sewing machine raffle tickets at the philanthropic workshop on Saturday.

Parliamentarian/Nette Louton \$420, not \$450 as stated before, was made on the table sale. Nette wants everyone working together to cover any open board positions for next year. 2nd Vice President/Quilt Show Chair is open. After several dedicated years as Quilt Show Chairperson, Jamie Harrington is resigning. Suggested By-Laws and Standing Rules revisions will be posted in the December and January newsletter. Please review. Thank all of those who participated in the table sale in October.

Philanthropic/Kathy Judkins will deliver 12 quilts to the Children's Center in Lancaster. We are having a sew-in at Mayflower Gardens on Saturday. Attendees may work on their own projects or on philanthropic quilts. Kathy has quilts to bind, quilt sandwiches to pin-baste, and backs to be pieced. The room will hold up to 20 people. Attendees can also work on the patio. Everyone will need to wear a face mask inside the room. Sue Jacobsen quilted 5 more philanthropic quilts and Kathy has one more finished quilt.

Web Master/Kathy Greene related that Pauline Brown is donating hand quilting frames and a box of books to be part of the QS Treasures, and Pauline also donated fabric for Philanthropic. As Door Prize Chair, Kathy Greene is encouraging individual participation in contributing a basket for QS Raffle Baskets. Baskets do not have to be quilt related, and she has baskets if you need one.

Membership: Peggy Campbell Membership cards and roster booklets will be available for pickup on Saturday at the philanthropic event for those who haven't received them.

New Business Sue Jacobsen announced the results of the vote to meet in person for the General Meeting or to remain meeting on Zoom. Sue telephoned members who do not have an email address. Twenty-five voted to meet in person and 18 voted to remain on Zoom. All members have not voted. Of the members who called Sue Jacobsen, 15 members will not meet in person. Members expressed concerns that members who are not vaccinated will attend, and that members will not wear masks. Pat Stauning said that the church is requiring masks. This topic will be discussed by the board. Carolyn Lundie will send out an email inviting members to the board meeting.

exchanged vendor info with Ridgecrest Quilt Show Chair and emailed new vendor applications. The guild has been invited to show and sell tickets at the Ridgecrest Quilt Show. Our quilt show has been posted on the website, quiltguilds.com.

Treasurer's Report-Stephanie Shuping reported a

total income \$2007.35, total expenses were \$1782.62, and a net income of \$224.73. The \$420 from the table sale was used to offset this year's program costs. All speakers this year have been under \$600, so there is no need to send out 1099 forms. \$1266.10 is on hold for philanthropic. Nette Louton made a generous donation of batting to philanthropic.

Proposed by-laws revisions will be published in the December and January Newsletters. Hopefully, the guild will be voting on the revisions in January. Thank all of the guild members who participated in the table sales. The guild made a total of \$420.

We pressed, pinned, pieced, attached binding, quilted, and arranged squares to make a quilt top. We also talked, laughed, offered suggestions, and visited with people who dropped by to see what we were doing. We finished projects and took things to work on at home. We missed those of you who couldn't make it and hope to see you the next time we do this.

The budget will be revisited in January to see how much money is needed for philanthropic.

New Business /Sue Jacobsen reported on the vote results regarding resuming Guild General Meetings in person vs. virtual Zoom meetings after sending out an email ballot and calling members without email. 61% of the membership gave their input by email or personal contact. 25 voted to meet in person and 18 people prefer Zoom. 16 people would not attend if it's in person. People who would not attend in person believe that members would not follow mask mandates. Pat Stauning reported that people using the church must still wear masks. We are not currently paying rent for the room. Points that were voiced included: 1) The dining room at the United Methodist Church is too small and crowded for the number of people attending the meeting, 2) We would be paying the cost for Zoom and the cost for the church, 3) The cost of the church is unknown, it could be \$120 up to \$240, 4) The church would provide an IT person, so meetings could be attended by Zoom as well. All participants agreed that this discussion should be tabled until the January meeting. Stephanie Shuping believes that we should continue Board Meetings on Zoom. Peggy Campbell is concerned that if people are not willing to meet in person in February, will they be willing to help with the quilt show.

Challenge 2022

A ribbon runs through it. We have been through a lot in the last year, but one of the things that always keeps us sane and together is fabric. We are suggesting a challenge with a ribbon that will run through all of the mini quilts. The rules are:

1. The cost is \$5.00 which will be used for prizes.



2. You must incorporate the ribbon and it must extend beyond the border of the mini quilt by 2 inches on each side. The ribbons must be 3" wide at the border.

3. The quilt needs to be a complete quilt and be finished. Size is 12" x 18". They may be vertical or horizontal orientation.

4.<u>So do it now! Don't wait until April to get</u> your fabric. We can mail the fabric to you, or contact us and we will get it to you. Do it now!!!!!! Come and join the fun.

5. This challenge runs from now to the April meeting. You will have to deliver your quilt to us, Pat or me, by April 11th at the latest so we can arrange them.
