1st VP Pat Crook introduced Sue Jacobsen with the program, "My Quilting Journey."

Welcome/President Donna Roberts opened the meeting saying, "This is the first meeting of the year. Thank you so much, Sue Jacobsen, for a wonderful presentation."

Minutes: Cheryl Nieman moved to accept the November General Meeting Minutes as published in the December newsletter, and a second was heard from Carla Wolf. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report for November: Nette Louton moved to accept the November Treasurer's Report as published in the December newsletter, and a second was heard from Laura Beauregard. Motion passed.

The next board meeting is January 18 via Zoom at 5:30 pm. Pat Crook will be sending the Zoom link.

1st Vice President Co-Chair/Programs: Pat

Crook reported that Cheryl Nieman taught a wonderful New York Beauty class and Cheryl kept us on track and was extremely organized. Pat thanked Sue Jacobsen for her presentation and showing her wonderful quilts. Pat is working on getting a speaker for next month and will wait to schedule workshops until this Covid peak passes. Only one person has signed up for the challenge. A ribbon will be laced through the mini quilts to illustrate how quilts and quilters are linked together. Quilt must have a hole in which to pass the ribbon through. Cost is \$5.

2nd Vice President/Quilt Show: Jamie

Harrington May 14th and 15th have been confirmed by the Fairgrounds as the dates for the quilt show. Quilt Show meeting is on Tuesday, Feb 8th, at 6 pm via Zoom. Jamie says she needs a Boutique and Treasures Chairperson. Vendor confirmations and additional applications have been sent. Quilt Show flyers have been ordered and will be mailed out when Jamie receives them. Quilt Show entry and Auction forms are on the AVQA website. Eight vendors have signed up, and Cherry Berry wants to rent a 10 x 40 booth.

Parliamentarian/Nette Louton As stated in the By Laws, By Laws should be reviewed every two years. The By Laws committee has completed their review. A draft of the By Laws has been sent to everyone. Led by Nette Louton, members attending the meeting reviewed all the current changes proposed by the By Laws Committee. Changes were agreed on by assent of those members. Pat Crook moved that we accept the changes to the By Laws as noted, and Peggy Campbell seconded the proposal. Motion passed 27-0.

Philanthropic/Kathy Judkins reported that the Children's Center was closed before Christmas and she couldn't deliver any philanthropic quilts at that time. The Pregnancy Counseling Center in Palmdale is looking for quilt donations. Terri Moss took 12 quilts and 1 pillowcase to Carenet. **Zoom Coordinator-Pat Crook** announced 34 members present.

No Old or New Business

Announcements: Donna Roberts announced that Marta Garcia has an older Singer machine for sale. Sue Leone sent the info and a picture. Contact Donna for info if you're interested. Al's Vac and Sew are carrying almost all products that are needed for quilting and embroidery. Please support them. There are no longer any quilt stores in Tehachapi.

Peggy Campbell announced the passing on New Year's Eve of former member Cheryl Vieth.

AVQA Board Meeting Minutes, January 18, 2022

Meeting called to order 5:35 pm, via Zoom by President Donna Roberts being in the chair. Carolyn Lundie acting as secretary.

Minutes: The November minutes were approved as published in the December newsletter. Motion proposed by Nette Louton and 2nd by Kathy Greene.

President Donna Roberts greeted all in attendance.

Programs-Pat Crook Nette Louton has booked a speaker whose topic is Barn Quilts and Trails for the February programs. The March Program is to be determined. Nette would like to re-evaluate the Programs budget to determine if the guild can schedule more workshops than speakers.

Quilt Show/Publicity-Jamie Harrington reported that the date has been confirmed by the Fairgrounds

for the quilt show as of last week. Quilt Show meeting is on Tuesday, Feb 8th at 6 pm via Zoom. Boutique and Treasures Chair, Hospitality Chair, and Admissions chair still need to be filled. Vendor confirmations have been sent. Jamie still needs to send a vendor confirmation to Cherry Berry for a 10x40 ft. booth. Jamie quoted the prices for smaller booths. She has not established a price for this larger booth as the guild has not rented a space that size before.

Quilt Show flyers have been ordered. Quilt show entry and auction forms for members are on the AVQA website.

Treasurer's Report-Stephanie Shuping

Money Market Account Total Liabilities & Equity is \$29.264.61. Checking Account Net Income is \$-682.23. This is just a comparison between income in and income out of the budget. There is still adequate money in the budget to cover budgeted items until the end of the year. Programs have only used \$480 out of the \$3000 budgeted thanks to an input from the table sale. Pat Crook was concerned about the early order of quilt show flyers by Jamie Harrington. Jamie explained that she has to send them out at this time if we still have a quilt show. A discussion ensued as to the advisability of continuing the quilt show with a focus on recouping the money if we had low attendance and no one was comfortable enough to set up and work the quilt show. Peggy Vachon felt the 2nd VP should ask the Board for approval prior to spending money on the quilt show since we're in the middle of a pandemic. Jamie Harrington said that it is not the way it's written in the By Laws. More discussion ensued. Carolyn Lundie proposed a motion to table the discussion until April. Kathy Greene seconded. Motion passed 7-2. President Roberts assured everyone that, if needed, we would bring the issue up again before April.

Parliamentarian-Nette Louton retyped the By Laws according to the changes approved at the January General meeting and sent a copy to Carolyn Lundie and Kathy Judkins for editing. Donna Roberts clarified that the amended By Laws should include the words, "amended and corrected on …" Nette said she, Pat Crook, Kathy Greene and Kathy Judkins will be on the nominating committee. The guild will need a 2nd VP and Treasurer.

Philanthropic-Kathy Judkins During

January, Kathy Judkins took 11 quilts, 1 blanket, and 1 pillowcase to the Children's Center. Terri Moss took 11 quilts and 18 burp cloths to CareNet. Kathy has several quilt sandwiches ready to quilt.

Newsletter/Website - Kathy Greene After some difficulty with Homestead linking with the newsletter to the website, Kathy was able to fix the glitch. Kathy is hoping someone will take the free Little Gracie quilt fame donated through the website. It requires 6 ft. of space. Kathy Greene would like someone to take over monitoring the AVQA website for the coming year.

No Old Business

New Business Nette asked Jamie Harrington and Stephanie Shuping to write up a brief description of their responsibilities to encourage members to take the offices of 2nd VP/Quilt Show and Treasurer. Also, Nette Louton would like to discuss where and how the guild has our supplies stored. We're currently storing some things at people's houses.

Announcements: Nette Louton has found a place to donate your unwanted fabric called the Fabric Maker Place. She also encouraged members to check the internet to discover California's Barn Quilt Trails.

Babylock Jazz II Sewing and Quilting Machine

Al's Vacuum and Sewing in Lancaster has donated a Babylock Jazz II sewing and quilting machine to AVQA.

This machine has 12" workspace, 28 built in stitches with stretch stitch capabilities, 1000 stitches per minute, programmable needle up/down, handsfree pressure foot, 9 feet included, automatic needle threader, and automatic bobbin winder. These are just a few of its features.

We will be selling tickets. A packet is 24 tickets for \$20. Tickets are \$1 each or 6 for \$5.

Challenge 2022

Challenge: We only have 3 people who are interested in the challenge this year. Help! This is a challenge with a ribbon that will connect quilts to each other. Kind of weird that we only have three in the challenge. You know that you can do anything you want for the other part of the quilt, right? **Challenge:** A ribbon runs through it. We have been through a lot in the last year, but one of the things that always keeps us sane and together is fabric. We are suggesting a challenge with a ribbon that will run through all of the mini quilts. The rules are:

1. The cost is \$5.00 which will be used for prizes.

2. You must incorporate the ribbon and it must extend beyond the border of the mini quilt by 2 inches on each side. The ribbons must be 3" wide at the border.

3. The quilt needs to be a complete quilt and be finished. Size is 12"X18". They may be vertical or horizontal orientation.

4. So do it now! Don't wait until April to get your fabric. We can mail the fabric to you or contact us and we will get it to you. Do it now!!! Come and join the fun.

5. This challenge runs from now to the April meeting. You will have to deliver your quilt to us, Pat or me, by April 11th at the latest so we can arrange them.
