Program: Suzi Parron showed pictures of barn quilts and told anecdotes of their origins. To purchase her books and find information about barn quilt trails, go to her website, www.barnquiltinfo.com. It includes trails in California.

President Donna Roberts welcomed everyone.

Minutes: Nette Louton moved to accept the January General Meeting Minutes as published in the February newsletter, and a second was heard from Cheryl Nieman. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report for November: Diane Grooms moved to accept the Treasurer's Report as published in the February newsletter, and a second was heard from Peggy Campbell. Motion passed.

1st Vice President Co-Chair/Programs: Pat Crook

The March program will be Nancy Fuka who has given this lecture at QuiltCon. She will be speaking about what a certified judge does. Please bring questions to ask the judges.

In April the lecture will cover questions about thread from the Superior Thread web site. We will also be voting on the challenge quilts. There is still time to get involved. May program will be the final

organization of the Quilt Show which is on May 14 and 15. June program will discuss the quilt show results and also the officer change-over ceremony. Donna Roberts complimented Pat Crook and Nette Louton for the great job they're doing with programs.

2nd Vice President/Quilt Show: Jamie

Harrington announced the Quilt Show meeting is Thursday, Feb 17th at 6 pm via Zoom. Chairpersons are needed for Admissions, Boutique & Treasures and Hospitality. Please volunteer. This is our biggest fundraiser of the year. Worker sign-up will be in March & April. Jamie will send you quilt show flyers to distribute if you ask her. Post flyers on social media to advertise our quilt show. She has mailed the flyers to most guilds in Southern California. There is a new flyer for the web site. The quilt show dates are May 14, 10 am–5 pm, and May 15, 10 am-4 pm, set-up May 13, 8 am until finished. The gentleman with antique sewing machines will be back. Someone will demonstrate quilting. Diane Grooms will chair the auction and Karla Wolf is chairing the judging competition.

Historian/Diane Grooms is collecting photos of projects guild members have completed during the pandemic for a PowerPoint presentation during the quilt show. Please send her photos of the projects you completed.

Secretary/Carolyn Lundie: The guild received a letter requesting monetary gifts to Paraclete High School. Contact Carolyn if you care to donate.

Parliamentarian/Nette Louton said that we have not had anyone come forward for the positions that need to be filled for the following year, 2nd VP/Quilt Show and Treasurer. Only 4 people have signed up for the challenge. There is still time to get your fabric and directions from Nette. Nette will call members of the nominating committee regarding a meeting the first of next week.

Philanthropic/Kathy Judkins picked up quilts, blocks and fabric from Lynell Rodio, Peggy Campbell, and Harriet Spann. She has 13 quilts to donate next week.

Web Page/Kathy Greene: The Gracie II quilt frame for a long-arm sewing machine is still available for free. Frame set-up is found on a YouTube video and requires 6 ft. of space. The Leona Valley Art Guild is offering a merchant space at their gallery and thought a quilter or AVQA might be interested. The Leona Valley Art Gallery merchant fee would be \$40 membership plus the space fee of \$35-\$200 depending on size.

Attendance/Pat Crook: 26 members plus one guest, Suzi Parron.

Wheel of Fortune! Pam Rudduck and Kathy Greene were winners. Peggy Campbell will see that the recent prizes are delivered.

New Business: Donna Roberts announced that Peggy Vachon is retiring as Newsletter Chairperson. Please contact Donna if you would like the position.

AVQA Board Meeting Minutes **February 15, 2022**

Meeting called to order 5:34 pm, via Zoom by President Donna Roberts being in the chair. Carolyn Lundie acting as secretary.

Minutes: Nette Louton moved to accept the January General Meeting Minutes as published in

the February newsletter, and a second was heard from Jamie Harrington. Motion passed.

Programs-Pat Crook: The March program will be Nancy Fuka, a certified judge who has judged international, regional, local and QuiltCon quilts. Please bring questions to ask the judges. In April the lecture will cover Superior Thread, all about threads and needle sizes. Voting on the challenge quilts will take place. May program will be the final organization of the Quilt Show which is on May 14 and 15. June 9 program will be the officer change-over ceremony.

Quilt Show/Publicity-Jamie Harrington: The gentleman with antique sewing machines will be back. Quilt Show chairs are: Carla Wolf - Judging Competition; Diane Grooms - Auction and Presentation of quilts made during the pandemic; Terri Moss - Make and Take; Kathy Judkins - Philanthropic accomplishments; Sonia Frehn - Treasurer's Boutique; Jamie Harrington and Sonia Frehn,- Quilt check-in; Betty Putzka, JoAnn Guerrero, Sherry Delano -Vendor check in. The position of Hospitality is still open, and Sonia Frehn needs someone to fill in for her on Saturday. Please advertise the quilt show on Facebook. Help distribute flyers and bookmarks. Currently 14 vendors and crafters are signed up. All but three have paid. Jamie has sent out more vendor applications. The opportunity quilt needs to be taken to the Cotton Patch Quilters of Kern County Quilt Show in March and to any other quilt guilds that are currently meeting.

Treasurer's Report-Stephanie Shuping announced Budget Self-Storage has increased monthly rental from \$241.50 to \$250.50. It is our biggest recurring bill. We received a check for \$300 from the Network for Good. Our balance for this month is negative \$1970.94, meaning we had more outgoing cash than incoming. A discussion ensued regarding obtaining cheaper storage, but there was no resolution.

Parliamentarian-Nette Louton: The position of 2nd VP/Quilt Show is still open. The position of 2nd VP requires a person that is good with computers, good with people and consistency. Dixie Bahr has offered to be Treasurer.

Newsletter- Kathy Greene will prepare an article for the newsletter promoting guild positions and the need for auction items and Hospitality chairperson for the show. Kathy suggested the possibility of setting up the Grace II frame at the quilt show as a demo to help sell it with our Quilter's Treasures. The guild will not be filling a vendor space with the Leona Valley Art Gallery in March.

Old Business: none

New Business: Jamie Harrington raised the possibility of going back to in-person General Meetings. She said it is crucial for sign-ups for the quilt show. Discussion ensued regarding doing a split Zoom meeting and in-person meeting. Nette will check to see if Lancaster United Methodist Church is available for the next guild meeting.

Al's Vacuum and Sewing in Lancaster has donated a Babylock Jazz II Sewing and Quilting Machine to AVQA.

This machine has 12" workspace, 28 built-in stitches with stretch stitch capabilities, 1000 stitches per minute, programable needle up/down, hands-free pressure foot, 9 feet included, automatic needle threader, and automatic bobbin winder.

These are just a few of its features.

We are selling tickets. A packet is 24 tickets and costs \$20. Six tickets are \$5. One ticket is \$1.



YOUR QUILT IS NEEDED

It's time to submit your quilt entries for the AVQA Quilt show being held May 14-15, 2022. The deadline for entering your quilts is April 7th, but don't wait until then if you have finished your quilts already. For each entry you must submit a separate entry form and a picture. This can be done online by submitting both the entry form and the picture via email to Carla Wolf. The email address is listed in your AVQA roster. Please type "Quilt Entry" in the subject field. The entry form is an electronic form. Please read the entry rules and judging guidelines on page 2 of the form. Quilts entered for judging must be delivered to the AV Fairgrounds on Friday, May 13, between 8:00 and 9:00 am. Quilts for display may be delivered between 8:00 am and 12 noon. Quilts may be picked up after the show has concluded between 5:00 and 6:00 pm on Sunday, May 15. Quilts may only be removed through the checkout station. Please bring identification to pick up your quilts.

Once I receive your entry/entries, I will confirm the receipt with a return email. If you have questions or problems with the entry form, please reach out to me and I will do my best to help you.

AVQA Quilt Show Meeting, February 17, 2022

Meeting was called to order at 6:13 pm by 2nd Vice President, Jamie Harrington via Zoom. Carolyn Lundie acting as Secretary.

Attendees: Sherry DeLano, Sonia Frehn, Kathy Greene, JoAnn Guerrero, Jamie Harrington, Carolyn Lundie, Betty Putzka, Donna Roberts, Lynell Rodio

Jamie Harrington covered the following quilt show topics.

Positions: Jamie cited the positions currently filled for the quilt show. Carla Wolf is organizing the judging, Carla and Jamie will be doing quilt check-in. Quilter's Boutique and Treasures Booth will be chaired by Sonia Frehn. Sonia would like someone to volunteer to help with Quilter's Boutique and Treasures. Many items have been donated. Open positions are Admissions and Hospitality.

Quilt Show Entries: The number of quilts entered may have to be limited due to space limitations.

Features: Diane Grooms, Historian, is creating a presentation of quilts made during the pandemic. Email or send pictures of quilts to her. Terri Moss will be in charge of Make and Take.

Auction: Please give auction donations to Auction Chairperson, Diane Grooms. Corinne Gurney gave Diane Grooms items used during the last auction.

Baskets: Kathy Greene reported that no baskets have been received yet from Friendship groups, but 2 groups have committed.

Quilt Show Flyers: Kathy Greene picked up quilt show flyers for Jamie Harrington.

Vendors & Crafters: Jamie reported that we have 13 vendors and crafters signed up currently.

Admissions: Price is the same and pays for both days. Rather than using stamps or wrist bands for admission, attendees will present the Program for 2nd day admittance.

Quilt Show Cancellations: Several quilt guilds have canceled their quilt shows, yet several are still scheduled. Carolyn Lundie announced that the Carson Valley Quilt Guild sent out flyers for their quilt show in June. The drawing for both the Opportunity Quilt and Sewing Machine will be held even if the show cannot take place.

Sign-ups for quilt show jobs: In the event that we can't have an in-person general meeting, Carolyn Lundie suggested a meet and greet in the park to sign up for quilt show work times.

Possibility of In-Person Guild Meetings: Jamie Harrington reported that Nette Louton found out that the United Methodist Church in Lancaster does have internet and will let the guild know if it is possible to have an in-person meeting in March following their board meeting.

Judge for Quilt Show: The question of possibly not having a judged show because it's an additional expense was discussed.

Questions answered by Jamie Harrington:

Who will set up quilt frames? Someone is still needed to pick-up and deliver quilt frames from storage to the pavilion.

How many vendors are needed to make a profit? 23 to 26; we need 10 more. Jamie responded that she will check to see if the fairgrounds will give us a discount.

How much money has currently been paid towards the quilt show? \$500 has been committed to be paid and approximately \$1700 in rollovers from last year. The cost of the pavilion is \$4900 and approximately one-half has been collected.

When is the latest time to cancel? April
Several members questioned whether we should go ahead with the show.

Miscellaneous:

Jamie Harrington reported that Dragon Lady is not coming; taping the floors for vendors will be at 8:00

am on Friday; a judge has been chosen; there is one other quilt show the same weekend; and Long Beach Quilting by the Sea will be selling their opportunity quilt tickets.

Carolyn Lundie reported 89 current members. Lynell Rodio showed three quilt tops made by her friendship group to be finished and donated to the auction.

Next meeting is Wednesday, March 16.

Meeting adjourned 7:05 pm.
