The meeting was called to order at 5:57 p.m. by **President Donna Roberts** at the Lancaster United Methodist Church and via Zoom. Kathy Judkins acting as Secretary for Carolyn Lundie.

**1st VP/Programs Pat Crook** introduced the speaker, Jennifer Houlden, whose topic was "Creating Contrast in Your Quilts."

**President Donna Roberts** welcomed everyone after Houlden's presentation. She said we had a good turnout. If it's your turn to bring something for Hospitality next month, please consider donating water bottles as we will be out.

**Minutes:** President Roberts asked if there were corrections to the February general meeting minutes as published in the March newsletter. Pat Stauning said the dates of the retreat were wrong. They should be Monday through Thursday, August 21-24. Sue Jacobsen made a motion to approve the minutes as corrected. Cheryl Nieman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

**Treasurer's Report/Dixie Bahr:** President Roberts asked if there were corrections to the Treasurer's Report as published in the March newsletter. There being none, Sherry DeLano made a motion to approve the report, Lynn Aguirre seconded, and the motion passed. **President Roberts** announced that the next board meeting will be Tuesday, March 14, via Zoom at 5:30 p.m. Pat Crook will be sending the Zoom link.

Antelope Valley Quilt Association Board Meeting Minutes March 14, 2023

**President/Donna Roberts** called the meeting to order at 5:37 p.m.

**In attendance:** Donna Roberts, Stephanie Shuping, Jan Hall, Nette Louton, Pat Crook, Lynn Aguirre, Dixie Bahr, Maggie Konik, Carla Wolf, Kathy Greene, Kathy Judkins, Peggy Campbell

**Minutes:** There were no corrections to the February minutes as published in the March

newsletter. Stephanie Shuping made a motion to approve, Jan Hall seconded, and the motion passed.

#### 1st VP/Programs/Nette Louton for Pat

**Crook:** There is a sew-in on Saturday. We are trying to get a speaker for April. There will not be a sew-in in April because the Meet the Teachers SCCQG meeting will be that day. In May, we will be talking about the show.

2nd VP/Quilt Show/Stephanie Shuping said she had sent notes to everyone because there was a lot to cover and she wanted to talk about the auction. 1. Diane Grooms and Lynn Aguirre proposed that we have a silent auction of the quilts on Saturday. The high bid on each quilt would be its starting bid on Sunday. Photos of the auction quilts will be posted on the website, www.avqa.org, and on the public Facebook page, AVQA Festival of Quilts. There was a suggestion to have a "buy-itnow" price (like eBay does). The Wi-Fi connection at the Fairgrounds needs to be checked out. 2. Sales tax question. Dixie Bahr suggested pricing boutique items with sales tax included, but adding sales tax to the price of auction items. 3. Insurance question. A signed contract with the Fairgrounds has to be submitted to SCCOG 60 days ahead of the event. Stephanie has sent the contract and fee to SCCQG, but they have not responded. Suggestions were made to send them lots of e-mails and to contact SCCQG Representative Vicki Brown for assistance. 4. Discussion about whether or not to have programs printed for the show. Nette Louton and Kathy Judkins will get together on this. Suggestion was made to have a limited number of programs printed and/or to place several posters inside the pavilion.

#### **Quilt Show Committee Chairmen**

**Boutique/Nette Louton:** She is getting things. Discussion about what to do with leftover items. If the maker requests them to be returned, that will be done. Maggie Konik and Peggy Howard met with a potential vendor, Kena Quilt Studios, who does portraits on quilts. The information was sent to Peggy Vachon. **Judging/Carla Wolf:** There were 51 judged quilt entries. The \$10 per quilt fee will pay for the judge's fee and mileage and most of the cost of the ribbons. Display quilt entries are due at the next meeting.

**Baskets/Kathy Greene** gave out 5 baskets at the guild meeting. Donna asked about donating a basket of her own. Individuals may donate baskets.

**Publicity/Kathy Judkins:** I have 1,000 new flyers. I will mail some of them to guilds and distribute the rest to members. Sonia Frehn shared information with me about getting our show publicized by contacting the Communications Directors of Palmdale and Lancaster and the press desks of newspapers.

**Treasurer/Dixie Bahr** said we have a \$2,000 loss. At last month's board meeting, she had offered to get together with a group to discuss fundraising ideas. Some of these are a button counting contest at the show, a flapjack fundraiser at Applebee's, a sneakers-for-dollars collection, and holding a summer camp for teenage girls to learn to sew and quilts.

**Membership/Peggy Campbell** said we have one new member. Dixie asked who writes thank-you notes for donations and was told that it's the Secretary's job.

Kathy Greene said that the local Easter Seals group is starting an adult quilting class and is asking for donations of fabric and batting. She has found fabric in the shed that could be donated.

Kathy Judkins: I need to investigate quilt-making efforts for victims of the recent floods.

Donna Roberts offered free tickets for quilt shows in Norco and Lompoc. She has received a form from the International Quilt Show in Long Beach, July 6-8. She has the information for guilds to show their opportunity quilts. It's available on <u>quilts.com</u>.

Nette Louton is looking into a trip to Hoffman in June.

Since the last newsletter, we have signed a contract for using the fairgrounds. We will still need to finalize the number of tables/chairs (this will be done after the application deadline for vendors). A signed contract was necessary to apply for an insurance certificate from SCCQG and that has to be done 60 days prior to our event. SCCQG has now confirmed by email that they received our certificate request. Additionally, a letter requesting free parking was sent to the AV Fair Board of Directors.

Henry Konik and Steve Howard (husbands of Maggie Konik and Peggy Howard) have agreed to coordinate security for us. They could use some additional help from other husbands, adult sons and/or guild members who are so inclined. Maggie and Peggy are new members to our guild and we are grateful to have them contributing in a significant manner. Yvonne Rodriguez is coordinating setup and takedown of the show itself. My husband is also planning to help with transportation/setup/takedown of quilt racks. We do need help with large trucks on Thursday; late afternoon, to remove the racks from storage, deliver to the Van Dam building on Friday morning, load racks back onto trucks Sunday at the end of the quilt show and return to the storage unit on Monday to store the racks for the next show. Note: our quilt racks will need to be stored at homes on Thursday and Sunday evenings as our storage place is not open on Sundays.

**Great News!** As of March 20, 2023 the CA Attorney General Registry website says that our organization is current! This means that our paperwork is now correct and fees are paid. We are now waiting for the physical **raffle license**. We are good to go for our quilt show!!!
