AVQA Board Meeting Minutes July 19, 2022

Meeting was held via Zoom and was called to order at 5:38 p.m. by President Donna Roberts with Kathy Judkins acting as Secretary. The following members were present: Donna Roberts, Pat Crook, Stephanie Shuping, Peggy Vachon, Dixie Bahr, Nette Louton, Peggy Campbell, Kathy Greene, Kathy Judkins, Pat Stauning, Janet Hall, and Fran Bianchi.

Greeting/President Roberts: Donna welcomed everyone.

Minutes: Pat Stauning moved to accept the June Board Meeting Minutes as published in the July newsletter, and a second was heard from Kathy Greene. Motion passed.

Programs/1st VP/Pat Crook: The August meeting will be an ice cream social to be held at the church. If it's too warm inside, we will have it outside. Pat said she will try to set up Zoom for those who can't attend in person. The September meeting will be a welcome-back tea party. Members are asked to bring a teacup and make a hat to wear. Friendship circles and individuals are invited to make centerpieces for the tables. There will be a drawing for the centerpieces at the end of the meeting.

Ways and Means/2nd VP/Stephanie Shuping and Peggy Vachon: Stephanie and Peggy presented a list of goals and steps to achieve them. Stephanie said these are just thoughts and ideas. Some of the ideas they discussed were finding groups such as the Corvette Club, Palmdale Gem & Mineral Club, 4H, etc., who would like to have their public event in conjunction with our quilt show; charging \$10 per quilt entered for judging (no charge if just exhibiting); having the judging done a day or two days before quilt show set-up; exploring ideas for getting help with set-up and take-down from a veterans group, Paraclete, Scouts. Fran Bianchi commented that when she and Sherry DeLano chaired the Judging committee, they had the quilts judged the day before set-up and it worked out much better. Dixie Bahr asked how many quilts we are capable of displaying. Stephanie said she would find out that information. Kathy Judkins asked

about bringing back the fashion shows we used to have at our quilt shows. Other fundraisers were discussed such as having a craft fair. Nette Louton said we could make coasters to sell at the BLVD Market on Thursdays. Tables are rented for \$10. Peggy Campbell said we can ask about it at the Li'l Book Bug on Lancaster Blvd.

Treasurer's Report/Dixie Bahr: Dixie met Donna and Carolyn at the bank to change the Treasurer's signature on the account. She met with Betty Putzka about the retreat. The books are set up. She asked when reports are due to the newsletter editor, and Peggy told her the deadline is midnight on the Sunday following the board meeting.

Parliamentarian/Challenge/Nette Louton: Nette would like all officers to write up a list of things they do so people will volunteer to do jobs coming up. These will be delivered at the Welcome Back Tea. If they don't write one, she will. It would be much better if each officer does it. This would include the President, 1st VP, 2nd VP, Secretary, Treasurer, and Parliamentarian. She doesn't know what's going to happen with the Challenge.

Membership/2019-2022 Opportunity Quilt/Peggy Campbell: We have 51 members. Winner of the Opportunity Quilt is Maria Marcoux. She was a member of the Tehachapi Mountain Quilters at the time she bought her tickets, but she has since moved to Northeast Albany in Oregon. The winning ticket number was 3273. Peggy will take care of getting the quilt to Maria.

Philanthropic/Kathy Judkins: My friendship circle, Bits and Pieces, discussed the fact that many people on our Facebook group page are not members of AVQA. Should we stop posting the newsletter on Facebook since that is one of the benefits of membership? Should we post the newsletter later on AVQA.org? Peggy Vachon pointed out that we have discussed this in the past and decided that posting the newsletter is good for outreach. Maybe we can post a week later. The next philanthropic workshop is scheduled for August 6, 9:00 a.m. to 3 p.m., at Harshfield Terrace. I will plan on having this meeting unless I'm notified by Harshfield Terrace that they aren't allowing meetings there due to COVID. Please bring a mask to the meeting and be prepared to wear

it unless it has been deemed unnecessary in the Antelope Valley. I have numerous kits, tops to be quilted, and quilts to be bound. Thank you to everyone who has been helping. I am still looking for a new philanthropic chairman. In the meantime, Michelle Johnston and I are continuing to organize the fabric and quilts into storage boxes, and I will search for groups that need fabric.

Old Business: Stephanie Shuping asked if we have a Publicity chair. We need a promoter for the quilt. Kathy Greene has taken a picture of the quilt. For purposes of holding the raffle and for printing tickets, we need the date of the drawing, the name of the show, and the name of the quilt. Kathy Greene found the name of the quilt on the label: "Celebrating the USA."

New Business/Pat Stauning/Donna Roberts: Pat said that she has mail that was delivered to the church from the bank for the Secretary, Dixie Bahr. Last Thursday's meeting was cancelled but the church wasn't notified. The church needs to be notified of meeting cancellations as they have hired a security guard. The ice cream social needs to be coordinated with Samantha at the church. Donna asked about what the church will do if the state goes back to mask mandates.

Announcements: Peggy Campbell said Big Bear Lake is having a quilt show, October 14-15. The quilt show chairman sent flyers and a couple of free tickets. Will someone sign up to take the opportunity quilt to the show? Kathy Judkins said she might be able to do that.

Babylock Jazz II

Al's Vacuum and Sewing in Lancaster has donated a Babylock Jazz II Sewing and Quilting Machine to AVQA. This machine has 12" workspace, 28 built-in stitches with stretch stitch capabilities, 1000 stitches per minute, programable needle up/down,

hands free presser foot, 9 feet included, automatic needle threader, and automatic bobbin winder. The guild is selling tickets – tickets packet is 24 tickets for \$20, 6 tickets for \$5, or a ticket for \$1.
