She is an author, instructor, and award-winning artist whose artwork and writings have been published internationally. Her work has been featured on *Quilting Arts TV* and in *Quilting Arts* magazine.

Nanette's art is greatly inspired by nature. She frequently refers to this artistic style as naturescapes.

With nature-inspired textile art, the challenge is that there is never just one way to create a tree or leaf or animal. In her lecture, Nanette shares the diverse possibilities for creating nature-themed artwork. She will also introduce you to a variety of techniques to help you produce representational renditions of your own favorite naturescape.

#### AVQA Board Meeting Minutes, Sept. 13, 2022

Meeting called to order 5:42 via by President Donna Roberts with Carolyn Lundie acting as secretary. In attendance: Peggy Campbell, Pat Crook, Donna Roberts, Jan Hall, Kathy Judkins, Stephanie Shuping, Carla Wolf, Peggy Vachon, Carolyn Lundie

#### **Greeting/President Roberts:**

**Minutes:** August Board Meeting minutes were approved as published in the September newsletter. Kathy Judkins proposed the motion with a second by Stephanie Shuping. Motion passed.

**Programs/1<sup>st</sup> VP/Pat Crook:** Pat listed the proposed programs for the next few months. October will be Nanette Zeller, "Naturescapes" Art Quilting; Oct. Workshop is a Sew-In at Quartz Hill library; November's speaker is Carol Wilholt, "Six Sides and 1 Angle, so Many Possibilities." Workshop is undetermined. Discussion ensued regarding December meeting. Stephanie Shuping moved that a potluck Christmas party be held on Dec. 10<sup>th</sup> at the Lancaster library. Pat Crook seconded it. Motion Passed. The January speaker will be Kelly Ashton, "Fussy & Fabric, Let Your Fabric Work for You." Quilter's College will be in Feb. Pat Crook will be unable to be at our next meeting.

Harshfield Terrace: Members suggested making fabric bowls or postcards as gifts for Harshfield residents as a thank-you for the use of Harshfield Terrace. Pat Crook will call Harshfield to find the number of residents.

#### Ways and Means/2<sup>nd</sup> VP Stephanie Shuping:

Stephanie wrote a letter asking businesses for sponsorship for the Quilt Show. Arnie Rodio has volunteered to sponsor AVQA Quilt Show and Stephanie will ask Lynell Rodio the name of his business. Someone suggested that Diane Grooms might be consulted on the letter as she is a grant writer. Businesses who donate will get their business cards in our newsletter. Levels of donation will be designated as gold, silver, bronze, etc. **Ways and Means/2<sup>nd</sup> VP Peggy Vachon:** Peggy sent out new vendor letters with the exception of Al's Vacuum and Sewing as they donate a sewing machine for a raffle.

Membership/2021-2022 Opportunity Quilt/Peggy Campbell: Opportunity Quilt tickets are ready to distribute. Tehachapi Guild has offered to let us take our Opportunity Quilt there in Oct. and Nov. We need to let them know when we're coming. Peggy Campbell has volunteered to keep the Opportunity Quilt tickets at her house. She also will hand out yearly pins as soon as she gets more tenyear pins.

Philanthropic/Kathy Judkins: Kathy asked for suggestions of places to take the philanthropic quilts. Someone suggested the prison. Fourteen quilts have been completed to donate. Seven people attended the Sew-in in September. In Sept., our group had to leave Harshfield Terrace early because of a scheduling conflict at Harshfield. Kathy contacted the newspapers about publicity for AVQA. Several new members showed up for the tea. Opportunity Quilt pictures were picked up at Bohn's. Bruce Jacobsen will recrop the Opportunity Ouilt picture to include the binding before getting more pictures printed. Kathy Judkins reported that a new guild is starting in Mojave. After a discussion, it was agreed that we would share some of our philanthropic fabric.

**Newsletter/Peggy Vachon** mailed 6 newsletters. She said that is a good number because newsletters are so expensive. Peggy encouraged members to send in pictures of quilts or people quilting to add to the newsletter.

**New Business/Donna Roberts** would like to conduct Show and Share as it is done in Tehachapi. People sign up on a list to show their quilts in order to prevent people standing in a long line. The Opportunity Quilt will be displayed at the Farmer's Market to sell tickets through October. Volunteers are needed. The Farmer's Market can offer a nonprofit space in the market; however, the Application Fee of \$30 is a mandatory fee for every participating vendor.

Lynell Rodio and Mary Coker have been approached to design a new Opportunity Quilt. No one has currently volunteered to make it. We need volunteers.

**Announcements:** The Art Group will meet at Mayflower Gardens.
