Kelly loves to teach, and she readily shares with her students the discoveries that she makes along her guilt-making journey while encouraging her students to make discoveries of their own.

- 1. You need the Aunties Two Poppins Bag pattern
- 2. Focus Fabric 1- 1 yard Outside bag

Focus Fabric 2- 1 yard Inside bag

Focus Fabric 3-1/2 yard for binding, sashing

- 3. IN-R-Form Plus- 1 yard (Nette bought a bolt last time and will sell to first come) \$15.00 per yard
- 4. Stays for the top of the bag
- 5. Zipper- Annie's double sided 30"

Check the back of the pattern for all the materials.

I heard that Nani wants us to do some pre-class work. Please text me for that.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE


Happy New Year to each one of you.

All committee chairs for the Quilt Show are asked to attend each meeting.



Wishing you all a very Happy New Year! This New Year promises special OPPORTUNITIES for growth, health, and peace. Within AVQA there are OPPORTUNITIES to help you achieve some of these goals. The Executive Board positions we will be filling are President, 1st Vice President, Secretary, and Parliamentarian. This month's

AVQA OPPORTUNITIES article will focus on the requirements and responsibilities of these positions. If one of these positions feels like it is a good fit for you, just know you will have the help and support of the outgoing officer in addition to the help and support of your guild.

President: Our President is required to have previously held an Executive Board position for one year. The Duties of President are to preside over all meetings. She is the Chairman of the Executive Board and is an ex-officio member of all Standing Board Committees except the Nominating Committee. The President is a co-signer of checks. The President will select/confirm the Committee Chairs for the Standing Board positions. Above all, the President is a promoter of all things AVQA.

1st Vice President: The 1st VP is AVQA's Program Chair in charge of scheduling General Meeting Programs and Workshops. In the absence of the President, the 1st Vice President will perform such duties assigned to the President except signing checks. The 1st Vice President keeps in contact with Hospitality, Publicity, and Newsletter to keep them updated and aware of any special needs that would affect their positions. The position of 1st Vice President is the perfect job to have with a co-chair. Sharing with friends just makes this position even more fun!

Secretary: The Secretary records the minutes of each General and Executive Board meeting and publishes those minutes in that month's Newsletter. She has a mail key and receives all correspondence to AVQA and distributes to the appropriate Board Member in a timely manner. The Secretary answers any necessary correspondence and co-signs checks.

Parliamentarian: Assures that proper parliamentarian procedure is followed at all meetings. The Parliamentarian is the Chair of the Nominating Committee convened in January. This committee is made up of one Board member and three active members. The Parliamentarian prepares a ballot for the election if a position has more than one person on the ballot. The Parliamentarian maintains a permanent record of all AVQA property.

Please contact Nette Louton if you would like to fill any of these positions. Remember, you will not be alone; you'll have lots of help. Come join in the fun and friendships within the AVQA's Executive Board.
