The meeting was called to order at 6:06 pm by **President Donna Roberts** at Lancaster United Methodist Church, Kathy Judkins acting as secretary for Carolyn Lundie.

**President Donna Roberts** welcomed everyone and said it was good to see so many people at the meeting.

**Minutes:** The minutes from the May meeting were not sent to the newsletter editor.

**Treasurer's Report: President Roberts** asked if there were any corrections to the May Treasurer's report as published in the June newsletter. There being none, a motion was made by Lynn Aguirre to approve the report and seconded by Laura Beauregard.

The next board meeting will be at 5:30 pm on Tuesday, June 13, at the Greenhouse Cafe in Lancaster. This will be the Changeover meeting. The 2022-23 and 2023-24 Board members are expected to attend. We will meet in the patio room.

**1st VP/Programs/Pat Crook:** This Saturday Linda Rasmussen will teach a class on binding from 10 am to 2 pm at Quartz Hill Library. Bring basic sewing supplies and dark thread. Next month Cheryl Nieman will give a lecture, "Quilt As You Go." She will teach a class on advanced ruler work on Saturday, July 15, at Quartz Hill Library. The project will be a table runner called "Flower Power." Sue Leone at Al's Vacuum and Sewing is selling a set of rulers needed for the class.

**Peggy Vachon:** Stephanie and Peggy thanked everyone for their help with the quilt show and asked the quilt show committee chairmen to come to the stage for recognition and pictures. Peggy presented AVQA patches and cards she had made to the group and a small quilt to Stephanie. Parliamentarian/Nette Louton: She's done.

### Membership/Sunshine/Opportunity Quilt Promotion/Peggy Campbell:

Peggy Cruz will do Sunshine Attendance: 44 members and one Membership Drawing: 2 winners Peggy told us about the winner of the opportunity quilt, Jeanette Blackburn from Oceanside who won the quilt. Her birthday is July 4. She and her husband, Tom, lived in Lancaster 30 years ago and drove here to visit friends and see the show. Kendra Geiger from Santa Clarita won the Babylock Jazz sewing machine donated by Al's Vacuum and Sewing.

**Philanthropic/Kathy Judkins:** I brought kits for anyone who wants to work on them at home. I have 3 large boxes of quilt tops at home. Let me know if you would like to quilt them and I'll get them ready and deliver them to you. Our group met at Harshfield last Saturday and made binding, sewed tops, and bound quilts. Thanks so much to everyone who has been helping. I asked everyone who has worked on a philanthropic quilt for the last ten or more years to stand and then come up to the stage for pictures.

**Publicity/Kathy Judkins:** Thank you to everyone who got the word out about the quilt show. It's time to have a new Publicity chairman. I will happily provide guidance and support.

Website/Kathy Greene: Kathy is looking for someone to do the website. Peggy Vachon volunteered. Kathy talked about the commissioned quilt she's working on. She has a committee. Let her know if you'd like to help.

**Old Business:** Nani Johnson proposed dissolving the guild library since we have moved out of the storage shed. Dixie Bahr made a motion to dissolve the library and Stephanie Shuping seconded the motion. The motion was approved. Suggestions were made for what to do with the books. They will be brought to the meetings for the free table and books that aren't picked up could be donated to Friends of the Library. Donna Roberts explained that there was an emergency meeting of the Executive Board at the quilt show about vacating the storage shed to save money. Dixie Bahr had offered to keep the guild's racks, file cabinet, and boxes in her garage. The Executive Board voted to approve this arrangement.

**New Business:** Dixie Bahr said next year's opportunity quilt has been packaged into kits. The blocks are to be foundation paper-pieced. Dixie plans to have meetings to sew the blocks.

Donna Roberts told the guild about the exhibit, Community Stitches: Quilt Designs & Stories at the Pasadena Museum of History through September 10, 2023.

Donna thanked everyone for letting her be president for the last two years, and she called the 2022-23 Executive Board to the stage and read what she had written about each officer. Then She called the Committee chairmen up and Pat Crook distributed gifts.

**1st VP/Programs/Pat Crook** called the incoming Executive Board to the stage and read short, humorous summaries of their new jobs, awarding a candy bar that fit their job description to each. We still need a 2nd VP/Ways and Means/Quilt Show.

**Fat Quarter Drawing/Nani Johnson:** Peggy Campbell won the drawing. The colors for July are red, white and blue. Nani said she was looking for someone to do this job. Robynn Frame volunteered.

**Show and Share:** Laura Beauregard showed a beautiful quilt she had worked on for a number of years.

**President Donna Roberts** thanked everyone for coming.

**Minutes:** There was not a quorum at the May board meeting via Zoom, so the meeting was dismissed and the minutes were not taken.

**1st VP/Programs/Pat Crook:** Cheryl Nieman will speak at the July meeting on "Quilt As You Go." She will teach a class on ruler work. We will not have meetings in August due to the heat. The September meeting will be a Mad Hatter tea party.

**Parliamentarian/Nette Louton** collected the position books and keys before the meeting began and checked them out to the new officers and committee chairmen.

**Membership/Peggy Campbell** said 34 members had renewed their membership.

Web Site/Kathy Greene said she still has the Gracie frame if anyone is interested. Suggestions were made for how to sell it.

**Treasurer/Dixie Bahr** distributed copies of the proposed budget for 2023-24. She said \$9,000 needs to come in to make the budget work. She asked committee chairmen and officers to let her know if she hasn't given them enough. Dixie suggested a holding a mini-auction and boutique with crafters at the church.

Nani has talked with Dixie about having a pop-upstyle event at the church. Nette Louton suggested having a boutique chairman. Kathy Greene suggested having a booth or two at the Poppy Festival. However, that will be too expensive if we have to sign up as a for-profit group in order to sell raffle tickets, etc. Peggy Campbell said we should look into selling tickets at Mayflower Gardens. Peggy Howard asked about checking into the Home Show.

Our bank is offering Zell. Dixie will check into this.

Kathy Judkins will find out if we can join the cities of Lancaster and Palmdale.

**President Donna Roberts** asked for a motion to approve the budget with adjustments for membership, quilt show publicity, programs (education), and quilt show facility use. Nancy Walker made the motion to approve the budget as amended. Nani Johnson seconded. The motion carried.

**New Business:** Donna Roberts said the store manager at Ashley Furniture in Palmdale told her we could have a table inside the store for showing and selling tickets for the opportunity quilt. Nani Johnson reported that the storage shed is now empty.

Dixie Bahr said she has applied to the State of California for tax-exempt status. She has been selling assorted fabric that was in the shed at Antique Asylum. The AVQA library is contained in 60 boxes. Donna Roberts suggested that we put the books on the free table and take any leftover books to the Lancaster Library. Meeting adjourned at 7:22 pm.

Please encourage your friends to join the guild with you. The more people in the guild, the more fun we have and the easier it is to get things done.


### THE NEW LITTLE GRACIE II
