There were none, so she asked for a motion to approve the minutes from the April meeting as published in the May newsletter. Stephanie Shuping made a motion to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

Co-Treasurers/Lynn Aguirre and Stephanie Shuping: Stephanie Shuping made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Lynn said they have submitted a report to the State of California.

President/Nani Johnson called the meeting to order at 5:36 p.m. Kathy Judkins acting as Secretary. Location: Peggy Campbell's studio in Lancaster CA.

Attendance: Nani Johnson, Kathy Greene, Maggie Konik, Nancy Walker, Lynn Aguirre, Sue Jacobsen, Kathy Judkins, Nette Louton, Stephanie Shuping, Leinaala Strickler, Pat Crook, Geneve Molnar-Chan

President's Comments: Pat will take over as President at the June meeting. Nani won't be able to attend.

Minutes: Nani asked for a motion to approve the April board meeting minutes. Lynn Aguirre made a motion to approve the April board meeting minutes as published in the May newsletter. Sue Jacobsen seconded, and the minutes were approved unanimously.

Treasurer/Lynn Aguirre and Stephanie

Shuping: Lynn went over the Treasurer's Report. Stephanie talked about the report for the State of California. She said we really need a guild email address. Lynn said the budget will be coming up. She wants to have a pre-budget meeting. It will be on Tuesday, May 21st at 3:30 in person at Peggy's studio. On June 15, there will be a guild sew-in at Harshfield Terrace from 10:00 to 2:00. On July 11, Patricia Belyea will present a lecture, "The Unknowing of Creativity." On July 15, there will be a guild sew-in at Quartz Hill Library from 10:00 to 2:00.

Discussion about the guild needing to spend more money and time on teaching/education.

Stephanie Shuping talked about plans to teach lessons for beginning quilters. The classes will be on Saturdays, August 10, 17, 24, and 31 from 2:00 to 5:00 at the Boulders on Rancho Vista. Classes will be for members who have never made a quilt and for non-members who want to learn to quilt. Stephanie will use Eleanor Burns' *Quilt in a Day* log cabin pattern.

Parliamentarian/Nancy Walker: We had elections for the new year.

Membership/Sue Jacobsen: LeRae Humphrey and Joanne Gonzalez will be the new Membership chairmen. They have started helping at the Membership table. Sue is collecting membership dues and has started a new spreadsheet.

Retreats/Sherry DeLano: Nani announced that the retreat is still open.

Old Business: Nette Louton said she and Maggie Konik have cleared AVQA property from half of Dixie Bahr's garage. There is still the question of what to do about storing the racks. Sherry DeLano has checked with Special Flair. Nancy Walker will ask everyone to report the guild property they have to her. Leinaala Strickler will call to find out where storage units are available and what they cost. Pat Crook suggested the Harley Building as a place to hold the quilt show.

New Business: We need to decide whether to keep meeting at the church or go somewhere else. Suggested places: churches, Lancaster Presbyterian, Methodist Church in Quartz Hill.

AVQA member Geneve Molnar-Chan came to the meeting to say she has decided to stay in the guild and help. She has been a member for many years while she took care of her family. She thanked the board for holding up the guild for all these years.


