In this beginner rope bowl class, you'll learn the basic techniques to create your own personal rope bowls. These bowls can be used to help with organization or stylish home decor. They also make great gifts!

Rope Bowl Supply List:

- -Working sewing machine
- -Jeans needle or heavy-duty needle
- -Thread
- -Scissors
- -Pins
- -Cotton fabric if you want to try wrapping the rope or fussy cutting
- -Clothesline cotton rope, 1/4" You can use 3/16" rope, but the bowl will be softer (floppier). Rope must be braided, not twisted.

Antelope Valley Quilt Association General Meeting Minutes May 8, 2025

President/Pat Crook called meeting to order at 6:14 p.m. Secretary, Robynn Frame.

Minutes: Pat Crook asked if there were any corrections to the minutes from the April guild meeting. There were none, so she asked for a motion to approve the minutes as posted in the May newsletter. The motion was made by Stephanie Shuping, seconded by Lynn Aguirre. Motion carried.

President/Pat Crook welcomed everyone. She said April was a busy month. We participated in the Almond Blossom Festival. Unfortunately, it was so windy that we decided to leave. Then we participated in the Poppy Festival, inside, and we did well on Friday and Sunday. Saturday was cold and rainy. Pat said we need to get our name out to the public, make more people aware of who we are and that we have value. We need one or two people to take on the 1st VP job for this next year.

1st Vice President/Programs/Maggie Konik thanked the guild members who participated in the Quilt Challenge. On Saturday May 10, the Philanthropic group will be meeting at Harshfield Terrace from 10-2. On Friday, May 9, there will be a make and take for beginning quilters. They will be making a mug rug from 2-5. On Saturday, May 24, Nette will be teaching how to make a rope bowl at the Lancaster Library from 3-5:30. Saturday, June 14, we will have a sew in. Bring your own project to the Quartz Hill Library from 10-2. Cheryl Nieman will be talking about quilting with rulers at the July 10 meeting. On Saturday, July 12, she will teach a beginner's quilting with rulers class. \$30 fee.

Treasurer's Report/Lynn Aguirre & Stephanie Shuping: There is \$7,913.79 in the checking account. Almond Blossom Festival brought in \$133 in sales and \$35 in Opportunity Quilt tickets. The Poppy Festival brought in \$784 in sales and \$374 in Opportunity Quilt tickets. We sold \$280 in Opportunity Quilt tickets between Santa Clarita, Bakersfield and Tehachapi.

2nd VP: We have a 2nd VP for next year. Debbie Rifkin will be the 2nd VP. She is looking for an alternative place to hold the Quilt Show.

Membership/Opportunity Quilt Tickets/LeRae Humphrey/JoAnn Gonzalez: There were 28 members and 1 new member in attendance. Debbie Rifkin won the membership drawing.

Retreats/Sherry DeLano: Final payment for our Big Bear Retreat is due soon.

Challenge/Carla Wolf: Quilts made for the "My Happy Place" challenge revealed and voted on. Treasurer/Lynn Aguirre & Stephanie Shuping:


