November 18, 2025

**President/Pat Crook** called meeting to order at 5:34 p.m. Meeting was held at Peggy Campbell's

Sewing Studio in Lancaster. Robynn Frame, Secretary

**Attendance:** Pat Crook, Lynn Aguirre, Robynn Frame, Nette Louton, LeRae Humphrey and Kathy Judkins.

#### Welcome and opening remarks/Pat Crook:

Welcome. We had a great meeting with our speaker Janis Rivera. 13 people showed up for the workshop. Some of us got farther along than others but we had a lot of fun. We seem to be filling the sanctuary at the church with about 35 members showing up for our meetings. It was asked why we moved into the sanctuary. Answer: the hall was freezing in the winter and very warm in the summer and we weren't filling the space. We still have not heard back from the church whether we can use the space next year so we are still looking for an alternate space just in case they come back and say we can't use it.

Minutes/Pat Crook: Pat requested a motion to approve the October 2025 board meeting minutes as published in the November 2025 newsletter. Motion was made by Lynn Aguirre, seconded by Kathy Judkins. Motion carries.

**1st VP/Maggie Konik**. VACANT –Peggy Vachon will give a talk about machine embroidery and how you can quilt in the hoop. LeRae will think about how she can give a workshop on machine embroidery for January. Saturday, January 10<sup>th</sup> will be an after-Holiday Party and will be a potluck.

**2<sup>nd</sup> VP/Debbie Rifkin:** The boutique made \$542 and sold 10 raffle tickets. Kena Quilts, Al's Vacuum and Sewing and Material Matters have signed up to be vendors at the Quilt Show so far.

**Treasurer/Lynn Aguirre:** The boutique brought in \$602, less \$60 in the cash box, less sales tax for a total of \$487 for our group. submitted. IRS and State information sheet submitted.

**Publicity/Kathy Judkins**: I have submitted our opportunity quilt photo and quilt show information to the SCCQG website and will start sending it out to other websites that list quilt shows. Will put it on the Lancaster community page.

Parliamentarian/Nette Louton stepping in for Donna Roberts: We are looking for a new President, 1<sup>st</sup> VP, Parliamentarian and maybe others for next year. If members do not step up to take on these positions, there will not be a guild. We cannot run a guild without officers.

Committee Reports: Membership/LeRae Humphrey: We have a total of 60 members. Less than half have collected their membership booklets and opportunity quilt raffle tickets. Peggy Vachon would like an updated membership list sent to her. LeRae has proposed a new way of doing the raffle drawing for membership. It is a lot to hand out the tickets and deal with handing out other items. She would like to assign numbers to each member and pull a number which will go back in the bucket for next month. It was agreed upon to proceed with this method. The quilt show committee would like to have a membership table with a power point showing some of the things we do and taking membership applications.

Philanthropic/Kathy Judkins: We won't be meeting in December since both Terri and I have other events to go to, but the room at Harshfield is available if anyone wants to use it. I want to reduce the philanthropic stash in my house by having fabric sales/giveaways at the guild meetings every month until it's gone. Is there enough time and space to do this at the meetings? Yes, we can accommodate this. Also, we can sell fat quarters and ½ yard fabric at the boutiques.

Road to California/Kathy Judkins: I have emailed the volunteer information to the raffle quilt coordinator at Road to California. During the first week of January, I will send reminders to volunteers.

Although the December boutique at the Lancaster Library was canceled, we still need bowl cozies, potato bags, popcorn bags, and aprons for


upcoming boutiques and for our quilt show boutique. Your contributions make a big difference!
